

Section 115 – Elections

Section 115:00. Biennial Elections. To implement Minnesota Statute 412.023 (1973) which makes mandatory the provision for biennial elections in this “statutory city” there shall be no city election in 1975. Accordingly, and pursuant to statute, the term of office of councilman Karl Berlin (elected in 1972) which would have expired in 1975, is hereby extended for one additional year. Candidates for this office shall be eligible for election at the biennial election on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November 1976. The Councilman so elected shall serve a four year term thereafter.

Councilmen elected in 1974, and years thereafter, shall serve four year terms. The Mayor shall continue to serve a two year term.

City elections shall be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of each even numbered year commencing with 1974.

Section 115:02. Municipal Primary Election Established. REPEALED. Ordinance Number 251, which established municipal primary elections for the City, is hereby revoked and repealed by Ordinance Number 387.

Section 115 of the 1974 Code of Ordinances was amended by adding Section 115:02 in its entirety by Ordinance Number 251, passed and adopted January 21, 1993.

Section 115 of the 1974 Code of Ordinances was amended by revoking and repealing Section 115:02 Establishing Primary Elections in its entirety by Ordinance Number 387, passed April 6, 2010, published and effective April 20, 2010.
