Section 202 – Enforcement Officer

Section 202:02. <u>Parking Enforcement Officer.</u> The following city officials are designated as City of Foley's parking enforcement officers: Mayor, City Administrator, head Public Works employee, other enforcement officer as designated by the City Council, Community Service Officer employed or contracted by the City or any licensed peace officer. A parking enforcement officer may issue a parking citation and authorize a towing order.

Section 202:04. <u>Community Service Officer</u>. Community service officers are a non-law enforcement personnel who are responsible for providing routine patrol of the City to detect unwanted activities and deter criminal acts; assistance to City Administration in addressing ordinance violations such as parking, curfew, pet and nuisance ordinances; assistance to the Public Works Department in observing and reporting city streets and sidewalk conditions, public safety hazards and any observed issues concerning City buildings, lighting and traffic control devices; assistance to the Parks and Recreation Department in various aspects of securing and checking designated parks, sporting and recreation areas or facilities; assistance to the Fire Department, as directed, in maintaining public safety during fire calls; and other non-law enforcement services. A community service officer may be an employee of the City or a contracted service provider.

Section 200 of the 1974 Code of Ordinances was amended by adding Section 202 in its entirety by Ordinance Number 395, passed and adopted January 3, 2012.
