CITY OF FOLEY, MINNESOTA CITY COUNCIL MEETING – August 7, 2018

The Foley City Council held a regular meeting on August 7, 2018, at 5:30 p.m. at the Foley City Hall.

Members Present: Mayor Gerard Bettendorf, Councilmembers Jeff Gondeck, Kris du'Monceaux, Mike Kasner and Gary Swanson.

Members Absent: None

The pledge of allegiance was recited.

Motion by Swanson, seconded by Gondeck, to approve the agenda. Motion carried, unanimous.

Consent Agenda

Motion by du'Monceaux, seconded by Gondeck, to approve the consent agenda which includes the following:

- Approve minutes of July 10, 2018.
- Approve closing of Penn Street for homecoming parade on October 5, 2018.
- Adopt Resolution #2018-21 Accepting Donation.
- Approve payment of bills paid for by checks #50649-#50712.

Motion carried, unanimous.

Bryan Moshier - Foley Fire Relief Annual Report

Relief Treasurer Bryan Moshier presented the annual report for the fire relief, which shows a surplus of over \$116,000. Swanson asked about possibility of future retirements. Moshier indicated they anticipate two members in the next couple years. Moshier also reviewed how the projections assume all eligible members would retire at the current time. Moshier also indicated the relief may be asking for a raise in the future. Brunn clarified that the city is responsible for any shortfalls in the city's fire relief fund. Motion by Swanson, seconded by Kasner, to approve the report. Motion carried, unanimous.

Mayor's Comments & Open Forum

Karla Scapanski, 11015 Mayhew Lake Rd NE, Sauk Rapids, MN, was at the meeting to introduce herself as a candidate for the House of Representatives. Scapanski is the endorsed candidate of the Democratic Party.

Department Reports

Interim Police Chief Josh Lindgren gave an overview of the monthly law enforcement report. Lindgren also reported that new information was obtained regarding the Mr. Jim's robbery and some other robberies in town. An updated press release will be coming. Lindgren reported the squad is expected in within a few days and outfitted as soon as possible. Gondeck asked about the trade-in of the Impala.

City Engineer Jon Halter updated the council on the 2018 project and indicated things are moving along well considering some delays with utilities. Swanson inquired about timeline. Halter indicated the project is on schedule with the first layer of hard surfacing done by fall. Halter also reported on some additional information on the Highway 23 safety improvements and

some very preliminary quotes from some representatives which ranged from \$4700-\$5500 per sign. Halter requested council permission to obtain official quotes. Swanson asked about the possibility of the signs being moved. Halter indicated more than likely on the east end of town. du'Monceaux asked if the school has expressed any interest in participating. Staff indicated the school has committed their initial funding but nothing further. Staff also reported on the temporary signs that have been installed, including the trailer radar feedback sign. Kasner indicated it has definitely made it a safer area. du'Monceaux asked if the police department has noticed any change. Lindgren indicated its hard to tell with that short of a time period and without running a significant portion of radar work. Bettendorf indicated a desire to wait until the current project is complete before any further investment. Gondeck asked about obtaining definitive costs and if that would be helpful. Bettendorf requested the council to table the discussion. There was discussion to move forward. Motion by Gondeck, seconded by Swanson, to direct staff to officially obtain quotes for the September meeting. Kasner indicated the Quality of Life group has been fundraising on this item. Motion carried, unanimous.

Public Works Director Mark Pappenfus updated the council on the status of the temporary signs staff has placed on Highway 23. Swanson asked if the radar feedback sign could be obtained back when school starts. Pappenfus indicated the pool is closing on August 24th, and the park roof and cracksealing projects are ongoing. The council discussed the pool operations and how it is tracking this year. There was discussion on the rain activities and the effect on the city construction activities.

City Administrator Sarah Brunn updated the council on the status of the police department, indicating Chief McMillin will be returning the end of August. Brunn also thanked Interim Chief Josh Lindgren for his work as the transition went very smoothly. Brunn also reminded the council of the primary election and budget workshop.

Highway 23 Coalition Presentation

Aaron Backman, secretary/treasurer for the Highway 23 coalition presented information. Backman reviewed statistics and initiatives of the coalition indicating it is a private/public partnership organization. Backman gave an overview the work and funding obtained to expand four-lane projects on Highway 23 along the coalition corridor. Recent funding for a significant expansion had occurred in the previous bonding bill. Backman requested the city to consider joining the coalition. du'Monceaux asked about fees to join. Backman indicated between \$1,000-\$1,500. The council indicated a discussion on joining can be had at the budget meeting.

Old Business

Kasner indicated ongoing concerns with the Kampa Meadows drainage ditch. Swanson asked if anyone continued to mow after the county mowed it. Kasner indicated some digging would likely resolve the issue. The council indicated a desire to not get involved in private property issues.

New Business

The council discussed the possibility of selling land adjacent to Foley Lumber. City Attorney Adam Ripple gave an overview of what is allowed for the discussion in both open and closed session. There was discussion on the benefits of selling the land. The council determined a desire to consider the sale and went into closed session to discuss pricing.

Mayor Bettendorf closed the meeting at 6:30 p.m. to discuss the price of PID#130004183.

Mayor Bettendorf re-opened the open meeting at 6:52 p.m. The council discussed pricing strategies and directed the city administrator to relay the negotiations to Foley Lumber.



CITY OF FOLEY, MINNESOTA CITY COUNCIL BUDGET WORKSHOP – August 21, 2018

The Foley City Council held a budget workshop meeting on August 21, 2018, at 5:30 p.m. at the Foley City Hall.

Members Present: Mayor Gerard Bettendorf, Councilmembers Jeff Gondeck, Mike Kasner and Gary Swanson.

Members Absent: Kris du'Monnceaux

The pledge of allegiance was recited.

Motion by Gondeck, seconded by Swanson, to approve the agenda. Motion carried, unanimous.

Overview of City Investments

City Administrator Sarah Brunn gave an overview of the city investments from the prior year. The investments posted earnings of over \$22,000 in the prior year. Brunn elaborated how the city is limited on its investment options because of being a municipality.

Discussion on 2018 Budget

The operational budget and process was reviewed by Brunn. There was discussion on pool operations and cash. There was discussion on capital equipment such as the park mower and snow plow. The fire department fees and capital costs were discussed. There was also discussion on park shelter rents, public works employee allocations, dues, council technology, council room tables and chairs and park improvements to the bathrooms and courts.

Interim Police Chief Josh Lindgren gave an overview of the benefits of a school resource officer and summarized discussions that have been had with the Foley Schools and the Benton County Sheriff's Department. There was also discussion on costs and impact on the budget and proposed levy if Foley were to provide the officer. The school has preliminarily proposed splitting the costs of an additional full-time employee, 50/50. The council discussed the benefits which would include more school patrol and additional full-time coverage in the summer months. The council expressed a desire to partner with the school on this activity. They directed staff to place some funding in next year's budget and work with the school on details on when the officer could be implemented.

The City Administrator confirmed the budget and indicated the proposed levy would be raised higher to accommodate potential costs of additional police staffing. Tax capacity estimates due indicate a 6% increase, so the net impact on the overall taxes would likely be slightly lower than 2018. The preliminary levy would be presented at the September 4th council meeting.

League of MN Cities - Liability Insurance Limits Waiver

The council was presented with the tort insurance waiver for the city's liability insurance. Motion by Swanson, seconded by Gondeck, to not waive the statutory limits. Motion carried, unanimous.

Planning Commission Minutes August 13, 2018, 6:30 P.M. Foley City Hall

Members Present: Rosalie Musachio, Bill Bronder, Jeff Gondeck, Judy Weis, Noel Lewandowski

Members Absent: Amanda Welle

Others Present: City Administrator Sarah Brunn, City Attorney Adam Ripple

The meeting was called to order by Vice-Chair Bill Bronder.

Motion by Gondeck seconded by Lewandowski to approve the agenda. Motion carried.

No minutes were available. They will be provided at next meeting.

City Council Update

Gondeck updated the commission on the recent activities of the city council.

Site Plan Review - DMZ Trucking

Todd Olin from Bogart overviewed the addition and size. DMZ Trucking provided updated plans for the planning commission which incorporated initial staff comments. Olin indicated the structural drawings are in process and will be available prior to the issuance of a building permit. Gondeck questioned the lighting. Olin indicated lighting on the building and four poles in the lot with light not intrusive on surrounding properties. Doug Moulzolf, owner, overviewed the location of the lighting. Weis asked about the doors and if drawings were submitted. Moulzolf overviewed the door locations and style. Motion by Lewandowski seconded by Gondeck to recommend approval of the site plan contingent on structural drawings being submitted. Motion carried, unanimous.

K&K Auto Preliminary Plat Review

There was a question on necessary easements needed for water and sewer services and electrical. Jim Moshier, assisting the applicants, explained that the easement is missing and could be added. There was discussion on the fire wall agreement remaining recorded on the affected parcels. There was discussion on the need for parking and if adequate space is available. There was discussion on access and different possibilities if the existing access easement were not available. Lewandowski questioned why an easement is being used versus selling a larger portion of the lot to the new owner. Kackley indicated a desire to maintain access to the northeast portion of the auto parts store. There was discussion on addressing the building after the split. There was discussion on comments received from the State of Minnesota. There was discussion on parking requirements and if the newly created lot will meet the parking requirements. The planning commission noted that parking requirements will be in force and must be met once the new use is determined. There was additional discussion on the easement. Both parties desired the easement to protect their access and interest. Lewandowski expressed concerns about the subdivision with an easement. Motion by Gondeck seconded Musachio to recommend approval to the city council contingent upon the water/sewer easement noted on the preliminary plat, calculations on the floor-area ratio being provided and setbacks being noted on the preliminary plat. Musachio, Gondeck, Weis, Bronder – aye. Lewandowski – nay. Motion carried.

Other Business

The planning commission made a recommendation banning billboards in the city limits at the last meeting. Staff will finalize language and present to the city council in the future. There was also discussion on building occurring on the Hanes property Members will review the site and discuss at the next meeting.

Motion by Gondeck seconded by Musachio to adjourn. Motion carried.

We are writing to provide a summary of the revisions to the plans for the 2018 Site & Building Improvement Project on Lot 8 of the Foley Industrial Park.

We reviewed the comments and concerns received and have revised the drawings to address the various items. Following is a summary of the review comments and the revisions to the plans to address the concerns.

- 1. Trash Receptacle Area: DMZ Trucking, Inc. will have a trash bin on rollers, located inside the building and rolled out during times of disposal.
- 2. Lighting Plan: We revised the plan to incorporate the proposed site lighting locations. The light poles will be shoe-box type fixtures with adjustable cutoff shields to prevent light splash onto adjacent properties or right-of-way. The poles will be at 100' on center approximately 5' south of the south edge of the granite pavement (typical 4 locations).
- 3. Lot Building Coverage Calculation: The building lot coverage calculation is located on Sheet 3-Site Plan and reflects the maximum building lot coverage of 60% and actual building lot coverage of 12% which includes the existing structure and proposed building expansion.

- 4. Parking Calculation: In accordance with the City of Foley Zoning Ordinance, Section 7, Subdivision 1: 19, the parking requirement is eight (8) spaces plus one (1) space per two (2) employees. DMZ Trucking, Inc. anticipates a total of four (4) employees after the proposed expansion, which results in a total parking requirement of ten (10) spaces. We placed eight (8) visitor parking spaces near the front door and two (2) additional spaces on the concrete pad east of the proposed building addition which is designated for employee parking.
- 5. Architectural and Engineering Building Plans: We forwarded the building sections and material cut sheets via email. In addition, we have contracted Duffy Engineering, Inc. to complete the structural engineering tasks necessary for the proposed structure. We request that the site plan review be approved, contingent on the structural engineering drawings being submitted and approved prior to the issuance of a building permit.
- 6. Building Setbacks: We included the required minimum building setbacks in the general notes on Sheet 3 of 4. In addition, we included the minimum setback lines on the site plan and added dimensions to the site plan to illustrate the distance between the northeast property corner and the proposed building face, which is 182.3'.
- 7. Building Height & Exterior Material Finishes: The proposed building is planned to be a metal siding with metal roofs. The inside clear height will be 16'-0" and the height of the building is planned to be approximately 26'-8" measured from grade to the peak of the proposed building.
- 8. Barrier-Free Parking: We incorporated a barrier free parking space immediately outside the existing front door along with an accessible loading/unloading space in accordance with ADA and Minnesota Council on Disability regulations. In addition, we incorporated the required "No Parking" and "Van Accessible" parking signs on the site plan. Please refer to the construction detail on Sheet 3 for reference.
- 9. Asphalt Drive (north) and Concrete Drive (south): We coordinated with Mr. Mark Pappenfus regarding the necessary improvements for the south access drive from 3rd Avenue West. The original plan submitted had the northern drive access designated for visitors and employees and the south access drive designated for truck traffic ingress/egress. After discussing this issue with Mr. Pappenfus, Public Works Director, we incorporated a concrete apron drive approach at the south entrance, which will extend from the edge of the existing road to the east right-of-way line. Please refer to the revised site plan for revisions.

- 10. Water & Sewer Services: Water and sewer service, if any, will be extended from within the existing building to serve the proposed building expansion.
- 11. Storm Water Treatment Facility: The storm water treatment basin will be constructed in accordance with the plans approved in 2015 and the topsoil stockpile, adjacent to the storm water pond will be either utilized during construction or removed from the site.

We attached the revised plans in pdf format for your reference. Please review the drawings and contact our office if there are any outstanding questions or concerns. We look forward to working with you through the course of review and construction for this project.

The firewall and use agreement should not be released unless the safety concern has been addressed. It should continue to be indexed against both parcels in the Recorder's office even after the plat, so there shouldn't be anything additional to do on that.

It looks like the proper setbacks and lot width are used. What about floor-area-ratio? It appears that there is compliance, but it would be prudent to require the calcs.





RESOLUTION 2001-25

A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT APPLICATION OF EDINA DEVELOPMENT CORP.

WHEREAS, an application was made by Edina Development Corp. for a conditional use permit to create a planned unit residential development within a "R-1" Single and Two Family Residential District, to be known as to be known as Lange Estates Fourth Addition, as per said application and preliminary plat and preliminary grading plan as submitted; and

WHEREAS, a notice of public hearing was given according to State law and the Foley Zoning Ordinance. Said notice was published at least once in the Official Newspaper, of the City of Foley, and was mailed to individual properties within 350 feet of the parcel included in the application; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held jointly by the planning commission and the City Council on September 18, 2001, at 7:20 P.M., at which the possible adverse effects of the proposed conditional use and any additional requirements necessary to reduce any adverse effects were considered.

WHEREAS, after the Planning Commission has found that:

- 1) That the conditional use will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for purposes already permitted.
- 2) That the establishment of the conditional use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for predominant uses in the area.
- 3) That adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other necessary facilities will be provided.
- 4) That adequate measures will be taken to provide sufficient off street parking and loading spaces to serve the proposed use.
- 5) That adequate measures will be taken to prevent and/or control offensive fumes, dust, noises and vibrations so that none of those will constitute nuisance, and to control lighted signs and other lights in such a manner that no disturbance to neighboring properties will result.
- 6) That proper facilities will be provided which would eliminate any traffic congestion or traffic hazard that might result from the proposed use.
- 7) That there has been demonstrated need for the proposed use. **

8) That the proposed use is in compliance with all other land use plans adopted by the City.

Therefore, be it resolved that the City Council of Foley, makes the following findings:

- 1) That the findings and recommendations of the Planning Commission are hereby adopted by the City.
- 2) That a conditional use permit is granted to Edina Development Corpaccording to the application and the preliminary plat of Lange Estates Fourth Addition and the preliminary grading plan for Lange Estates Fourth Addition
- 3). That the property involved is legally described as follows:

Block One Lange Estates Fourth Addition.

4) That the conditional use permit is granted solely for the project described in the Application for the permit, and that any variance by the developer from the project shall be approved by the City Council.





SS-1. (1802) QUALIFICATION OF WORKERS

The provisions of MnDOT 1802 are hereby supplemented with MnDOT 2545.1B and the following:

Certified Contractor personnel shall be on the Project work site at all times to perform or directly supervise the installation of the Dynamic Speed Display Signs.

SS-2. (2564, 2565) DYNAMIC SPEED DISPLAY SIGNS

This work consists of the following:

A. Salvaging and reinstalling in-place Type C signs and posts; and providing and installing materials and electrical equipment as specified herein, all for two (2) complete operating dynamic speed display signs, along Trunk Highway 23 (west of Norman Avenue and east of 8th Avenue) in the City of Foley, Benton County,

all in accordance with the Minnesota Department of Transportation "Standard Specifications for Construction, 2018 Edition", with the application provisions of MnDOT 2564 and MnDOT 2565; with the current edition of the National Electrical Code; with the Plans; and as follows:

SS-2.1 GENERAL

A. Base Bid and Alternate Bid

Be aware and consider with their bids on this project that the project includes a Base Bid and an Alternate Bid for dynamic speed sign installation work by the Contractor. The Base Bid includes all materials, electrical equipment and labor in order to furnish, install, and mount the new dynamic speed display signs on standard U-channel sign posts. The Alternate Bid include all materials, electrical equipment, and labor in order to furnish, install, and mount the new dynamic speed display signs on standard traffic signal pedestal poles instead of on standard U-channel sign posts.

For both the Base Bid and the Alternate Bid, the salvaging and reinstallation of the in-place R2-1 (Speed Limit) signs and posts adjacent to the new dynamic speed display sign installations is included as part of these bids. The furnishing and installing of the dynamic speed display signs, solar panels, and all related sign components (with the exception of the mounting components) are also included in both the Base Bid and the Alternate Bid. Only the mounting components (U-Channel sign posts or standard traffic signal pedestal poles) are different between the Base Bid and Alternate Bid.

The City of Foley has the discretion to accept or reject a bid for the Base Bid only; or the City will accept or reject a bid for the Alternate Bid only.

The City of Foley will not accept bids from separate Contractors to complete the Base Bid or Alternate Bid work separately (one Contractor will be selected for either the Base Bid work only, or for the Alternate Bid work only).

C. Shop Drawings

PROVIDE SHOP DETAIL DRAWINGS FOR MATERIALS AND ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT AS SPECIFIED IN THE CONTRACT DOCUMENTS.

D. Warranty

Warrant and guarantee satisfactory in-service operation of all materials and electrical equipment of each Dynamic Speed Display sign installation in accordance with MnDOT 2565.2A5, except that the period of in-service warranty is **three (3) years** beginning with the acceptance of the Dynamic Speed Display signs by the Engineer. With regards to the required warranty, the following shall be noted and addressed with the bid for this work:

1. <u>Definitions</u> and Terms:

- a. Final Construction Acceptance (FCA) the date when the warranted dynamic speed display sign construction is complete, each system is made operational, and all required punch list work on each system has been addressed and accepted by the Engineer. This date constitutes the start of the warranty period.
- b. Warranty Bond a surety that guarantees that the warranty requirements are met.
- c. Warranty Limits the warranty shall include the pedestal poles and bases, and all dynamic speed display sign components.

All other dynamic speed display sign components (conduit, foundations, sign posts, etc.)

ī						

shall be covered under the standard one-year warranty as per MnDOT 2565.2A5.

- d. Warranty Period the Warranty Period shall be three (3) years starting at the FCA.
- e. Warranty Work corrective actions taken to bring the warranted work into Contract compliance for release of the warranty bond.

2. Warranty Bond:

Furnish a single-term warranty bond in the amount of \$25,000 for the warranted dynamic speed display sign components. Furnish the bond to the City of Foley at the same time as the other Contract Bonds specified in MnDOT 1305. The effective starting date of the warranty bond must be the FCA. The warranty bond will be released at the end of the Warranty Period or after all warranty work has been completed, whichever is last. The form of the warranty bond shall be acceptable to the Contracting Authority.

3. End of Warranty Period Inspection:

At the end of the warranty period, the Engineer will inspect each complete dynamic speed display sign installation to confirm that these system components are fully operational and in acceptable condition. The Contractor or their designated representative may be present during the end of warranty period inspection.

4. Corrective Action Requirements:

If any of the dynamic speed display sign components listed above are found to be inoperational due to normal system operation or in poor condition due to normal conditions, corrective action (warranty work) may be required. The City of Foley may, at their option, require corrective actions at any time within the warranty period, or defer corrective action until the end of the initial warranty period.

For all corrective actions required, the Contractor shall provide a written proposal for correcting the defects within ten (10) days of being notified that corrective action is required. The City of Foley shall respond as to the adequacy and suitability of the proposal within ten (10) days or the date of the Contractor's submittal.

The proposal shall include, as a minimum:

- The proposed construction remedy.
- The proposed schedule for prosecution and completion of the work.
- The proposed traffic management plan.

The Contractor is responsible for obtaining all necessary permits to complete the corrective action work.

In the event that the Contractor causes additional distress to the surrounding surfaces

(boulevards, roadway surfacing, etc.) during corrective action operations, these repairs will be required in accordance with current City of Foley standards, at no cost to the City of Foley.

During the warranty period, the Contractor will not be held responsible for distresses that are caused by misuse, negligence, or accident that are not the fault of the Contractor. Upon written request from the Contractor and on a case-by-case basis, the City of Foley will consider other factors that appear to be beyond the control of the Contractor.

The Contractor shall commence corrective action work within fifteen (15) Calendar Days after notice by the City of Foley of acceptance of the written plan for warranty correction. If the work cannot be started then because of seasonal limitations, the Contractor must so notify the City of Foley and submit (for City approval) a schedule for completion of the corrective action work. Failure by the Contractor to respond to the City of Foley or undertake corrective action within the specified period of time will be cause for the City of Foley to undertake the corrective action work itself and recover the costs of such work from the warranty bond.

If the Engineer determines that emergency repairs are necessary for public safety, the City of Foley may perform the repair action. The City of Foley, or their representative, will authorize emergency repairs. Prior to emergency repairs, the City will document the basis for the emergency action, and will preserve evidence, such as photographs or video, of the defective condition. Emergency repairs will be coordinated with the Contractor when possible. Emergency repairs that are warranty work (Contractor's responsibility) will be charged to the Contractor.

All costs associated with warranty repair work will be the responsibility of the Contractor, with no compensation from the City of Foley. These costs include, but are not limited to, mobilization, labor, materials, traffic control, miscellaneous clean-up, turf establishment of disturbed areas, etc.

5. Acceptance:

The City of Foley and the Contractor must joint review all completed warranty work or a portion thereof, as determined by the Engineer. If the work does not meet the Contract requirements, the Contractor must make all necessary corrections at their own expense prior to acceptance. Acceptance will occur as soon as the City of Foley determines that the Contract requirements have been met for the warranty work. The date on which acceptance occurs is termed Final Warranty Acceptance (FWA).

Neither the FCE nor any prior inspection, acceptance, or approval by the City of Foley diminishes the Contractor's responsibility under this warranty.

Both the FCA and FWA will be documented in writing and executed jointly by the City of Foley and the Contractor. The City will send a copy of these documents to the Contractor's warranty bond surety agent upon completion of the Warranty Period.

All warranty requirements are incidental to the Dynamic Speed Display Sign pay items.

E. Miscellaneous

Location of sign posts, foundations, and other sign system components are shown in the Plans in their approximate location and will be determined in the field by the Engineer prior to installation.

Perform construction operations in the proximity of utility properties in accordance with the provisions of MnDOT 1507, except the first paragraph is hereby deleted and the following substituted therefore:

It is the Contractor's own responsibility, prior to commencing work, to secure information and determine the exact location of any buried utility facilities as may exist, and to conduct operations in the vicinity of any such facilities in a manner that precludes damage thereto. The Contractor agrees to be fully responsible for any and all damages that might be occasioned by failure to exactly locate and preserve any and all underground utilities.

Consider excavations, backfilling, removals and disposition thereof, and surface restoration as incidental work, and no direct compensation will be made therefore.

<u>Contractor</u> responsibilities as part of making each dynamic speed display sign operational (incidental to project) shall include the following work items:

- Providing and installing any necessary panels, jumpers, terminal blocks or harnesses in the dynamic speed display signs;
- Testing the operation of the complete dynamic speed display signs in the presence of the Engineer and City of Foley personnel, prior to acceptance of this work by the City;
- Completing all connections and jumper wiring at all applicable locations;
- Verifying that new dynamic speed display sign equipment is operational to the satisfaction of the Engineer; and
- Labeling all applicable cables, conductors, racks, etc. as applicable using a permanent labeling device (handwriting of labels is NOT acceptable).

SS-2.2 MATERIALS

A. Painting

Do not paint pedestal poles, bases, wind collars, sign posts, or sign housings (leave in their galvanized and/or unpainted condition).

B. (2564) Traffic Signs and Devices

Salvage and reinstall in-place R2-1 (Speed Limit) signs and posts (including in-place two U-channel sign posts and A-frames) to be adjacent to the location of the new dynamic speed display sign installations.

Provide and install new ground splice posts for in-place U-channel sign posts (to be placed at a minimum of 3.5 feet below ground line in accordance with current MnDOT signing installation details included elsewhere in these Special Provisions). Take care to protect all sign structure components during salvaging and reinstallation, and replace any sign structure components damaged by the Contractor due specifically to Contractor work, all at no expense to the Owner.

In-place sign relocation work is incidental to both the Base Bid and Alternate Bid and shall be completed as part of both the Base Bid and Alternate Bid.

For the Base Bid dynamic speed display sign installations, provide and install 3 lb/ft flanged channel sign posts (2 posts, each with A-frames as noted in the Plans) in accordance with MnDOT 2564, MnDOT 3401, and the details included elsewhere in these Special Provisions.

C. Dynamic Speed Display Signs

The following minimum specifications for Dynamic Speed Display (DSD) signs are to be met for use on this project.

All DSD signs shall meet the following minimum specifications:

The DSD sign's changeable display requirements:

- The display shall be illuminated and/or have reflective properties (such as flip-discs) for day readability.
- · When used, the following reflective flip-disc colors are allowable based upon their special usage:

School Zones:

Fluorescent Yellow-Green

Work Zone Advisory:

Fluorescent Orange

Advisory Warning Speed Zones:

Fluorescent Yellow

Other Speed Zones:

Fluorescent Yellow

- When used, the reflective flip-discs shall be covered with sign sheeting meeting the performance requirements of Type IX or Type XI sheeting.
- · The illuminated display shall dim properly for night readability.

- The display should be a minimum height as listed above.
- The illuminated display color shall be yellow or amber LEDs (580-592 nm).
- The display shall be capable of showing a 2 digit number.
- The display shall be clearly readable at a minimum of 325 feet from the sign installation.
- The display should have a minimum of 2 inches of opaque contrasting margin around the illuminated digits. The dimension may be reduced after a field review of readability for particular sign performance.

The DSD sign's static sign requirements:

- The static sign shall have the message in black: "YOUR SPEED" in all cap letters in either Highway Font "E" or "D". The minimum height of the font is listed above.
- The static sign background shall meet MnDOT specifications for retroreflective sheeting for the appropriate color for the type of speed limit zone usage:
 - a. School Zones w/plaque (S4-3): White or Fluorescent Yellow-Green*
 - b. Work Zone Advisory: Fluorescent Orange
 - c. Work Zone w/plaque (R2-6a): White or Fluorescent Orange*
 - d. Temporary Work Zones: White
 - e. Advisory Speed zones: Yellow or Fluorescent Yellow
 - f. Speed zones: White
 - * Note: allowed when the appropriate plaque is used on the speed limit sign
- The Minnesota Standard Signs Plate for "Dynamic Speed Display Signs" (see attached figure) should be followed for the static sign design and layout minimum standards. Variations of the standards may be approved based upon field review and readability performance.

The DSD sign's operational requirements:

- · The DSD sign shall monitor traffic for advancing vehicles via radar.
- The manufacturer / vendor must supply data on power requirements and performance for DSD sign.
- The DSD sign shall be programmable for the posted speed limit and the threshold speed.
- · The DSD sign shall detect and activate the alert when the posted speed is exceeded by one mph.

- When the alert is activated, the display shall flash at a rate of 50 to 60 cycles per minute.
- When the detected speed exceeds the maximum, the display shall go blank (or black).
- When no advancing traffic detected, the display shall be blank.
- The DSD sign shall not have any strobes or flashing lights.

The DSD sign's mounting / installation requirements:

- · DSD signs on permanent sign structures shall be crashworthy.
- Portable sign structures that are typically provided with the DSD sign by the manufacturer / vendor shall meet NCHRP 350 Category 4 requirements.
- Two (2) U-channel sign posts (meeting the requirements of MnDOT 3401 for flanged channel sign posts, 3 lb/ft minimum) along with two (2) A-frames shall be provided and installed with each DSD sign installation AS PART OF THE BASE BID.
- For Alternate Bid installations, dynamic speed display signs shall be securely fastened to standard traffic signal pedestal poles using Engineer approved mounting hardware to securely mount each sign to the pedestal pole surface.
- A NEMA approved aluminum enclosure shall be provided with each DSD and mounted on the back side of each DSD (or on the back side of the standard traffic signal pedestal pole) to provide protection for cables and for any other electrical equipment associated with the DSD.
- The manufacturer / vendor shall supply any documentation of any crash testing the DSD sign structure has passed or documentation of exemption from crashworthy requirements.
- · The DSD sign shall have all installation, programming, and maintenance manuals.
- · Location of DSD structures will be determined in the field by the Engineer prior to installation.
- The Contractor shall provide one (1) copy of the applicable speed data collection and reporting software for the DSD, and shall verify that the standard RS232 data port is included with the DSD installation to allow for City access and downloading of data from the sign installation. The Contractor shall also provide training to the City in how to use the software, access the DSD, and download data from the sign installation. These items shall be considered incidental to the DSD installation work.
- The Contractor shall provide an overview of the operation and basic maintenance of the DSD to the City's maintenance staff, prior to final acceptance of the DSD (incidental).

The Contractor shall warrant and guarantee satisfactory in-service operation of all materials and electrical equipment in accordance with MnDOT 2565.2A5, except that the period of in-service warranty shall be three (3) years beginning with the "turn on" of each DSD.

D. Solar Powered Equipment

For each solar powered dynamic speed display sign installation, provide and install all required batteries and solar panels needed to make each installation operational to the satisfaction of the Engineer.

Battery:

- a. Battery packs shall be of the size and type standard to the installation of dynamic speed display sign systems installed in the State of Minnesota.
- b. All batteries shall be sealed in a plastic film to provide moisture and corrosion resistance. Batteries shall be housed in an aluminum tube.
- c. All batteries shall be manufactured to operate over a temperature range of -40 degrees F to \pm 180 degrees F.
- d. All battery connectors shall conform to Ingress Protection, IP-67 rating, dust proof, and protected from temporary immersion in water up to 3 feet deep for 30 minutes. Connectors shall be Deutsch DTM series or approved equal.

Solar Panel:

- a. All solar panels shall be sized to provide sufficient power to maintain operation of each installation and provide up to 13.5 watts peak total output sized for all climate and geographical locations.
- b. All panels shall be mounted to an aluminum plate and bracket at an angle of 45 to 60 degrees to provide maximum output. Bracket shall be secured to a 2 3/8 inch aluminum tube. Note that COLLECTOR MUST FACE SOUTH OR IN THE APPROPRIATE DIRECTION TO PROVIDE MAXIMUM SUNLIGHT TO EACH SOLAR PANEL.
- c. All fasteners used shall be anti-vandal.
- d. Wire used shall conform to military specifications, MIL-W-16878D, Type D, vinyl nylon jacket.
- e. The solar panel assembly shall be fully self-contained onto a 2 3/8 inch round aluminum housing.
- f. All solar panel connectors shall conform to Ingress Protection, IP-67 rating, dust proof, and protected from temporary immersion in water up to 3 feet deep for 30 minutes. Connectors shall be Deutsch DTM series or approved equal

E. Pedestal Poles and Bases (Alternate Bid)

Traffic control signal pedestal shafts and pedestal bases must be in accordance with the applicable

Provide traffic control signal pedestals in accordance with MnDOT 3832. Pedestal pole installations include anodized (unpainted) slipfitter collar, pedestal pole, pedestal base, and wind collar.

F. Bonding and Grounding

All bonding and grounding shall be in accordance with the National Electrical Code; with the Plans; and with the applicable provisions of MnDOT 2565.3H.

SS-2.3 CONSTRUCTION REQUIREMENTS

A. Installation of Dynamic Speed Display Sign System

Install the complete dynamic speed display sign system with all required control equipment.

Provide and install all additional materials and electrical equipment for a complete operating dynamic speed display sign system installation (which includes, but is not limited to):

- 1. Sign posts (Base Bid) or pedestal pole mounting hardware (Alternate Bid).
- 2. Bonding and grounding materials and connections.
- 3. Make all field conductor connections as directed by the Engineer to make dynamic speed display sign system fully operational.

B. Pedestal Foundations (Alternate Bid)

Pedestal pole foundations shall be provided and installed by the Contractor in accordance with MnDOT Standard Plate 8112.

Provide and install a 3-inch PVC conduit that stubs out from each pedestal foundation as noted in the Plans (cap both ends-for future use).


Provide and install an Engineer approved ground rod from each foundation as noted in the Plans.

Provide end bell bushings on end of all non-metallic conduits entering each pedestal pole base.

C. Pedestal Reinforcing Collar (Wind Collar) Installation

Where pedestal reinforcing collars are utilized, clamp each reinforcing collar around the top of the pedestal base by using two (2) 5/16" Socket Head Bolts per section (see figure below).

Each section must have a 5/16" pilot hole for drilling into base. Drive a 5/16" x 3/4" Roll Pin through the collar into the base (flush to allow 1/4" penetration into the base) to prevent the pedestal shaft from turning in the pedestal base.



D. As-Builts

Provide to the Engineer two (2) sets of "as-built Plans" (for the dynamic speed display signs) that contain any **changes** in the following:

- pole/post locations
- conduit sizes or conduit runs
- types of foundations
- bracketing or mounts
- other items as required by the Engineer.

Any discrepancy or additions between the final plans and how the system was actually built <u>must be indicated</u> on the "as-built plans."

The "as-built Plans" shall be in a form that is satisfactory to the Engineer. Providing As-Built plans shall be considered incidental to the Dynamic Speed Display Sign System bid item.

Consent Agenda

A few items are on your consent agenda. One includes starting the hiring process to create a part-time officer eligibility list. We need to update our list and anticipate needing additional part-time officers in the future. A change order reflecting the removal of the gas main is also in your packet. There will be reimbursement from Xcel and a small portion of costs which will be shared between the city and county. Lastly, a hiring approval is included with a letter from the Fire Chief.

DMZ Trucking - Site Plan Approval

DMZ is looking to expand their location in the industrial park. The planning commission meeting minutes and a site plan application information is included in your packet. The only condition planning is recommending is that structural drawings are provided prior to the issuance of the permit. Staff is recommending approval with this condition.

K&K - Preliminary Plat Review

A public hearing must be conducted on the preliminary plat of K&K. This is a proposed subdivision of the Jax Firehouse building and K&K Auto. Planning did recommend approval with the conditions listed and staff is recommending the council approve with the conditions specified. A final plat will need to follow and this plat will be recorded.

Brad Du'Monceaux - Progressive Builders - Poplar Place

Brad du'Monceaux has been working with city on constructing townhomes in the Poplar Place development located along County Road 51 on the south end of town. A PUD was issued in 2001 by the council but has expired because no construction occurred within a year. A copy of this approval is included in your packet. An application for a PUD has been re-submitted but requires planning review prior to council consideration. Due to concerns with weather, Mr. du'Monceaux is requesting consideration of starting footings and concrete work prior to the official approval. Staff would be comfortable allowing this to occur since this is a renewal of a previously approved PUD but only if a letter of credit or cash security is provided and an agreement is signed. Mr. du'Monceaux will be at the meeting on Tuesday to discuss this with the council.

Discussion on 2019 Budget

A resolution adopting the 2019 preliminary levy is included in your packet. This levy includes a portion of funds for additional police staffing if needed next year. Even with the levy increase of 4% we still anticipate a decrease overall to the taxpayers as we are planning for 6% growth in tax capacity. Please note this is the levy that will go out on homeowner's proposed tax statements. It can be lowered but not raised. It should also be noted that the city has no control in shifting of taxes between residential and commercial properties and also the increase or decrease in property values.

Hwy 23 Safety Improvements

Staff obtained quotes on the radar feedback signs for Highway 23 and they are included in your packet.

Update on wastewater facility plan

We have sent correspondence to the MPCA and have been in contact with them. We are planning on a conference call/meeting very soon. I will provide an update to the council with the results of this meeting as soon as it occurs.

Swimming Pool Update

A financial summary is included in your packet which wrap up the 2018 season. I am also meeting with the pool manager to wrap up the season and obtain a report from her. I will provide that to you at the meeting.

Discussion on potential land sale of PID 130004183

I relayed the discussions of the council to the interested buyer. They indicated they will respond back once they have had time to think it over.

Planning Commission

The planning commission will be addressing a PUD application for Poplar Place at their next meeting. We are also expecting a plat from Gopher to be submitted soon.
