#### CITY OF FOLEY, MINNESOTA CITY COUNCIL MEETING – October 6, 2020

The Foley City Council held a regular meeting on October 6, 2020, at 5:30 p.m. at the Foley City Hall.

Members Present: Mayor Gerard Bettendorf, Councilmembers Jeff Gondeck, Rosalie Musachio, Gary Swanson and Jack Brosh.

Members Absent: None

The pledge of allegiance was recited.

Motion by Brosh, seconded by Swanson, to approve the agenda. Motion carried, unanimous.

#### **Consent Agenda**

Motion by Gondeck, seconded by Musachio, to approve the consent agenda, which includes the following:

Motion carried, unanimous.

#### Public Hearing - Water/Sewer Delinquent Accounts & I/I Penalty Charges

At 5:31 p.m. Mayor Bettendorf opened the Public Hearing regarding delinquent water/sewer accounts and I/I penalty charges.

Jerome Keller, 340 7 ½ Avenue, addressed the council asking for his bill to be adjusted due to the water leak that caused two of his quarterly bills in 2019 to be significantly higher than expected. Keller expressed his frustration and claimed that he did not use the water that the meter said he used. Discussion followed with Mark Pappenfus Director of Public Works providing more information regarding Keller's complaint, when it was brought to staff's attention, and what was done to investigate. Pappenfus told the council it was determined that Keller's water softener was the source of the leak. Keller rejected the explanation from Public Works. Sarah Brunn City Administrator joined the discussion stating that Keller had not made any payments to his water bill since October of last year. Discussion followed with several councilmembers commenting and asking questions. Pappenfus stated the meter was not misread.

At 5:48 p.m. Mayor Bettendorf reconvened the regular meeting. A motion was made by Swanson, seconded by Musachio, to approve Resolution #2020-26 Assessing I/I Penalities and Resolution #2020-27 Assessing Water/Sewer Delinquent Charges. Motion carried, unanimous.

#### Mayor's Comments & Open Forum

No one spoke.

#### **Department Reports**

Police Chief Katie McMillin gave an overview of the calls for service in September. There were a total of 297 calls. McMillin said she had received an increased number of requests for record checks for permit to carries for other agencies. Reporting of suspicious activity from residents was also up. Thefts had also seen an increase. McMillin also informed the council that due to COVID restrictions she would not be doing Halloween safety presentations in the schools. Instead she would record video presentations that would be posted on social media for the kids to watch.

Mark Pappenfus Director of Public Works gave an overview of several projects, including the solar bees repaired at the wastewater ponds, fire hydrant painting, and water tower maintenance. Pappenfus informed the council the water tower would need a full refurbish in 2-3 years. Discussion followed on other Public Works issues.

Pappenfus also gave an update on a few Fire Department items. One of the department's tanker trunks experienced transmission trouble returning from a call and had to be towed. The new rescue truck has arrived and will be in service once the department completes necessary training. Fire safety usually presented in the schools this time of year for Fire Prevention Week will be done outside.

Pappenfus asked the council for direction on moving forward with pool coping. Two bids had been received. The work would be completed in the spring prior to the pool opening.

Motion by Musachio, Swanson seconded, to accept the recommended bid and proceed with the project. Motion carried, unanimous.

Pappenfus also presented a bid for a new playground structure to be installed in the spring. The exact location for the new structure would be determined later. The bid included supervised installation.

Motion made by Swanson, seconded by Gondeck, to accept the bid for the playground structure. Motion carried, unanimous.

Sarah Brunn gave an overview of her administrative report. She asked the council for direction on possibly opening up the council chamber for outside groups to use for meetings. The council room has not been used outside of city business due to cleaning concerns and COVID restrictions. After several minutes of discussion, Mayor Bettendorf and the council instructed staff to allow some essential groups (e.g. Foley Chamber, Alcoholics Anonymous, Official City Boards, Driver Examiner...etc...) to use the meeting space as long as they cleaned the room after use or paid to have the room cleaned.

Brunn gave an update to the council regarding CARES funding including extra radio purchases. McMillin shared with the council that Foley PD had applied for and received a \$4,000 FEMA grant to help pay for COVID cleaning expenses and PPE. Discussion followed. Musachio asked staff to investigate the possibility of purchasing room purifiers.

Brunn also reminded the council that the November meeting would be moved to Nov. 10 due to Election Day. Brunn also shared that she had a meeting regarding lighting for Hwy 23. MN DOT will

proceed with standard lighting designs, but will give the city options for banner and holiday decorations.

#### **Old Business**

Gondeck gave a brief update on the Parking & Storage Ordinance. The Planning Commission reviewed the ordinance and did not recommend additional changes, but said residents could continue to address concerns with the Commission or apply for a variance. One letter had been received from a resident prior to the Planning Commission's meeting. No residents attended the Planning meeting to express concerns. Discussion followed. McMillin said all previous complaints regarding the ordinance had been resolved.

Brunn gave an update on the Orderly Annexation/Joint Planning Agreement. Gilmanton Township has tabled the wastewater project is completed. Brunn gave an overview of the city's options and encouraged the council to read in more detail.

Brunn gave an update on the wastewater project. She told the council she had met earlier with Bolton and Menk who recommended moving forward with design to meet necessary deadlines. Discussion followed.

#### **New Business**

No new business.

Mayor Bettendorf closed the regular meeting at 6:43 p.m. for discussion on potential land price per Minn. Stat. 13D.05 Subd. 3(c) 13D.05.

Mayor Bettendorf reopened the regular meeting at 6:56 p.m. Staff was advised to continue the conversations with the landowner.

Motion by Swanson, seconded by Gondeck, to adjourn. Motion carried, unanimous. Meeting adjourned at 6:56 p.m.

#### Policy/Procedure Manual

#### 202 : Required Training

- A. All Foley Police Officers which the City holds their license shall complete the following training yearly/or otherwise noted:
- 1. ALL League of MN Cities (LMC) Online PATROL Courses Yearly in the following categories:
  - -Use of Force
  - -Crisis, Conflict, Community Diversity
  - -OSHA
  - -Critical Knowledge
- 2. In-Class Room Defensive Tactics/Use of Force Yearly
  - a. The "In-Class Room" portion of Defensive Tactics and Use of Force shall be completed the same day as the Hands-on portion and through LMC Online Patrol. (Refer to Syllabus)
- 3. Hands-on Defensive Tactics/Use of Force Yearly
  - a. The "Hands-on" portion of Defensive Tactics and Use of Force shall be completed yearly by every officer. Foley Police Department will host this training once a year by the Department's Use of Force Instructor or another instructor. (Refer to Syllabus)
  - b. Officers who are unable to attend this training shall complete the training with another agency. Officers must provide the Chief of Police or Training Officer with certificate of completion of training with approved MN POST number.
- 4. Taser Training Yearly
  - a. Taser Training shall be completed yearly by each Foley Officer. Taser training will be offered during the Hands-on Defensive Tactics/Use of Force training by the Department's Taser Instructor or Benton County. (Refer to Syllabus)
- 5. Firearms Training
  - a. Firearms Training will be instructed by the Benton County Sheriff's Office Police Chief or the Chief's designees or another approved by Chief of Police Police Chief or the Chief's designee.
  - b. All firearms courses must be approved by MN POST Board.
  - c. Foley Police Officers shall shoot the following yearly:
    - Regular Qualification Course
    - Malfunction Qualification Course
    - Low-Light Qualification Course (Both Hand-gun and Rifle)
    - Shotgun Qualification Course
    - Rifle Qualification Course
    - Adverse Weather Shoot
  - d. Refer to Chapter 3 for Firearms Syllabuses
- 6. Emergency Vehicle Operations (EVOC) Training
  - a. EVOC training shall be completed every 3 to 5 years.
  - b. EVOC is done through MN Highway Safety and Research Center in St Cloud.

### Policy/Procedure Manual

#### 7. EMR/First Responder Training

- a. Per City of Foley Police Department Officer all Foley Officers shall be licensed as an EMR/First Responder.
- b. EMR/First Responder Refresher Training shall be completed every 2 years upon initial training course completion.
- c. Refresher course shall be completed through any Agency that has been approved by Chief of Police.

#### 8. NIMS Training

- a. NIMS Courses 700, 800, 100, 200 shall be completed by all Foley Officers within the first 14 months from their hiring date.
- b. Additional NIMS Courses that are offered free online are also highly recommended to all Foley Officers; but is not mandatory.

#### 9. Mental Health/Implicit Bias/Crisis Intervention Training

- a. The chief law enforcement officer of every state and local law enforcement agency will have to provide in-service training in these three areas: Crisis intervention and mental illness crises, Conflict management and mediation, Recognizing and valuing community diversity and cultural differences to include implicit bias.
- b. The training must consist of a combination of 16 of these continuing education credits within an officer's three-year licensing cycle.

#### 10. Miscellaneous Training Courses

- a. Periodically Chief of Police will receive free online training courses (DWI Webinar, OPUE, Crime Alert, etc.) This training shall be completed by all Foley Officers
- \*\* Failure to complete all of the above training by deadline given by Chief of Police or Training Officer shall reflect in Performance Evaluations which is Public and/or loss of work days until training is complete.

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#### 202.1 Mandated OSHA Training

A, OSHA Training is offered through LMC Online PATROL Training Yearly.

\*\* Failure to complete all of the above training by deadline given by Chief of Police or Training Officer shall reflect in Performance Evaluations which is Public and/or loss of work days until training is complete.

#### Chapter 3

#### 300: USE OF FORCE AND DEADLY FORCE MODEL POLICY MN STAT 626.8452

#### 1) PURPOSE

It is the policy of the (law enforcement agency) to provide officers with guidelines for the use of force and deadly force in accordance with:

MN STAT 626.8452 DEADLY FORCE AND FIREARMS USE; POLICIES AND INSTRUCTION REQUIRED;

MN STAT 626.8475 DUTY TO INTERCEDE AND REPORT;

MN STAT 609.06 AUTHORIZED USE OF FORCE;

MN STAT 609.065 JUSTIFIABLE TAKING OF LIFE; and

MN STAT 609.066 AUTHORIZED USE OF FORCE BY PEACE OFFICERS.

#### 2) POLICY

It is the policy of this law enforcement agency to ensure officers respect the sanctity of human life when making decisions regarding use of force. Sworn law enforcement officers have been granted the extraordinary authority to use force when necessary to accomplish lawful ends. Officers shall treat everyone with dignity and without prejudice and use only the force that is objectively reasonable to effectively bring an incident under control, while protecting the safety of others and the officer.

Officers shall use only that amount of force that reasonably appears necessary given the facts and circumstances perceived by the officer at the time of the event to accomplish a legitimate law enforcement purpose.

Officers should exercise special care when interacting with individuals with known physical, mental health, developmental, or intellectual disabilities as an individual's disability may affect the individual's ability to understand or comply with commands from peace officers.

The decision by an officer to use force or deadly force shall be evaluated from the perspective of a reasonable officer in the same situation, based on the totality of the circumstances known to or perceived by the officer at the time, rather than with the benefit of hindsight, and that the totality of the circumstances shall account for occasions when officers may be forced to make quick judgments about using such force.

This policy is to be reviewed annually and any questions or concerns should be addressed to the immediate supervisor for clarification.

This policy applies to all licensed peace officers and part-time peace officers engaged in the discharge of official duties.

#### 3) DEFINITIONS

- a) Bodily Harm: Physical pain or injury.
- b) Great Bodily Harm: Bodily injury which creates a high probability of death, or which causes serious, permanent disfigurement, or which causes a permanent or protracted loss or impairment of the function of any bodily member or organ or other serious bodily harm.
- c) Deadly Force: Force used by an officer that the officer knows, or reasonably should know, creates a substantial risk of causing death or great bodily harm. The intentional discharge of a firearm in the direction of another person, or at a vehicle in which another person is believed to be, constitutes deadly force.

#### Policy/Procedure Manual

- d) *De-Escalation*: Taking action or communicating verbally or non-verbally during a potential force encounter in an attempt to stabilize the situation and reduce the immediacy of the threat so that more time, options, and resources can be called upon to resolve the situation without the use of force or with a reduction in the force necessary. De-escalation may include the use of such techniques as command presence, advisements, warnings, verbal persuasion, and tactical repositioning.
- e) Other Than Deadly Force: Force used by an officer that does not have the purpose of causing, nor create a substantial risk of causing, death or great bodily harm.
- f) Choke Hold: A method by which a person applies sufficient pressure to a person to make breathing difficult or impossible, and includes but is not limited to any pressure to the neck, throat, or windpipe that may prevent or hinder breathing, or reduce intake of air. Choke hold also means applying pressure to a person's neck on either side of the windpipe, but not to the windpipe itself, to stop the flow of blood to the brain via the carotid arteries.
- g) Authorized Device: A device an officer has received permission from the agency to carry and use in the discharge of that officer's duties, and for which the officer has:
- a. obtained training in the technical, mechanical and physical aspects of the device; and b. developed a knowledge and understanding of the law, rules and regulations regarding the use of such a device.

#### 4) PROCEDURE

- a) General Provisions
  - 1. Use of physical force should be discontinued when resistance ceases or when the incident is under control.
  - 2. Physical force shall not be used against individuals in restraints, except as objectively reasonable to prevent their escape or prevent imminent bodily injury to the individual, the officer, or another person. In these situations, only the amount of force necessary to control the situation shall be used.
  - 3. Once the scene is safe and as soon as practical, an officer shall provide appropriate medical care consistent with his or her training to any individual who has visible injuries, complains of being injured, or requests medical attention. This may include providing first aid, requesting emergency medical services, and/or arranging for transportation to an emergency medical facility.
  - 4. All uses of force shall be documented and investigated pursuant to this agency's policies.
- b) Duty to Intercede

Regardless of tenure or rank, an officer must intercede when:

- 1. present and observing another officer using force in violation of section 609.066, subdivision 2, or otherwise beyond that which is objectively reasonable under the circumstances; and
- 2. physically or verbally able to do so
- c) Duty to Report

An officer who observes another officer use force that exceeds the degree of force permitted by law has the duty to report the incident in writing within 24 hours to the chief law enforcement officer of the agency that employs the reporting officer.

#### Policy/Procedure Manual

#### d) De-escalation:

- 1. An officer shall use de-escalation techniques and other alternatives to higher levels of force consistent with their training whenever possible and appropriate before resorting to force and to reduce the need for force.
- 2. Whenever possible and when such delay will not compromise the safety of another or the officer and will not result in the destruction of evidence, escape of a suspect, or commission of a crime, an officer shall allow an individual time and opportunity to submit to verbal commands before force is used.

#### e) Use of Other Than Deadly Force

- 1. When de-escalation techniques are not effective or appropriate, an officer may consider the use of other than deadly force to control a non-compliant or actively resistant individual. An officer is authorized to use agency-approved other than deadly force techniques and issued equipment in the following circumstances:
  - a. effecting a lawful arrest; or
  - b. the execution of legal process; or
  - c. enforcing an order of the court; or
  - d. executing any other duty imposed upon the public officer by law; or
  - e. defense of self or another.

#### f) Use of Certain Types of Force

- 1. Except in cases where deadly force is authorized as articulated in MN STAT. 609.066 to protect the peace officer or another from death or great bodily harm, officers are prohibited from using:
  - a. Chokeholds,
  - b. Tying all of a person's limbs together behind a person's back to render the person immobile, or;
  - c. Securing a person in any way that results in transporting the person face down in a vehicle.
- 2. Less than lethal measures must be considered by the officer prior to applying these measures.

#### g) Use of Deadly Force

- 1. An officer is authorized to use deadly force if an objectively reasonable officer would believe, based on the totality of the circumstances known to the officer at the time and without the benefit of hindsight, that such force is necessary. Use of deadly force is justified when one or both of the following apply;
  - a. To protect the peace officer or another from death or great bodily harm, provided that the threat:
    - i. can be articulated with specificity by the law enforcement officer; ii. is reasonably likely to occur absent action by the law enforcement officer; and iii. must be addressed through the use of deadly force without unreasonable delay; or
  - b. To effect the arrest or capture, or prevent the escape, of a person whom the peace officer knows or has reasonable grounds to believe has committed or attempted to commit a felony and the officer reasonably believes that the person will cause death or great bodily harm to another person under the threat criteria in paragraph (a), items (i) to (iii), unless immediately apprehended.

#### Policy/Procedure Manual

- 2. An officer shall not use deadly force against a person based on the danger the person poses to self if an objectively reasonable officer would believe, based on the totality of the circumstances known to the officer at the time and without the benefit of hindsight, that the person does not pose a threat of death or great bodily harm to the peace officer or to another under the threat criteria in paragraph (1a), items (i) to (iii).
- 3. Where feasible, the officer shall identify themselves as a law enforcement officer and warn of his or her intent to use deadly force.

#### h) Training

- 1. All officers shall receive training, at least annually, on this agency's use of force policy and related legal updates.
  - 2. In addition, training shall be provided on a regular and periodic basis and designed to
    - a. Provide techniques for the use of and reinforce the importance of de-escalation
    - b. Simulate actual shooting situations and conditions; and
  - c. Enhance officers' discretion and judgement in using other than deadly force in accordance with this policy.
- 3. Before being authorized to carry a firearm all officers shall receive training and instruction with regard to the proper use of deadly force and to the agency's policies and State statutes with regard to such force. Such training and instruction shall continue on an annual basis.
- 4. Before carrying an authorized device all officers shall receive training and instruction in the use of the device including training as it relates to its use in deadly force and/or other than deadly force situations. Such training and instruction shall continue on an annual basis.
- 5. Officers will carry and use only authorized devices unless circumstances exist which pose an immediate threat to the safety of the public or the officer requiring the use of a device or object that has not been authorized to counter such a threat.
- 6. With agency approval officers may modify, alter or cause to be altered an authorized device in their possession or control.
- g) Recordkeeping Requirements

The chief law enforcement officer shall maintain records of the agency's compliance with use of force training requirements.

Policy/Procedure Manual

#### 1301: EYEWITNESS IDENTIFICATION PROCEDURES POLICY

Minn. Stat. 626,8433

#### POLICY:

Officers shall adhere to the procedures for conducting eyewitness identifications set forth in this policy, in order to maximize the reliability of identifications, minimize erroneous identifications, and gather evidence that conforms to contemporary eyewitness identification protocols. Photo arrays and line-ups will be conducted by displaying the suspect and fillers sequentially using a blind or blinded administration.

#### Purpose:

It is the purpose of this policy to establish guidelines for eyewitness identification procedures involving show-ups, photo arrays, and line-ups. Erroneous eyewitness identifications have been cited as the factor most frequently associated with wrongful convictions. Therefore, in addition to eyewitness identification, all appropriate investigative steps and methods should be employed to uncover evidence that either supports or eliminates the suspect identification.

#### **Definitions:**

Show-up: The presentation of a suspect to an eyewitness within a short time frame following the commission of a crime to either confirm or eliminate him or her as a possible perpetrator. Show-ups, sometimes referred to as field identifications, are conducted in a contemporaneous time frame and proximity to the crime.

Line-up: The process of presenting live individuals to an eyewitness for the purpose of identifying or eliminating suspects.

Photo Array: A means of presenting photographs to an eyewitness for the purpose of identifying or eliminating suspects.

Administrator: The law enforcement official conducting the identification procedure.

Blinded Presentation: The administrator may know the identity of the suspect, but does not know which photo array member is being viewed by the eyewitness at any given time.

Confidence Statement: A statement in the witness's own words taken immediately after an identification is made stating his or her level of certainty in the identification.

Filler: A live person, or a photograph of a person, included in an identification procedure who is not considered a suspect.

Sequential: Presentation of a series of photographs or individuals to a witness one at a time.

Simultaneous: Presentation of a series of photographs or individuals to a witness all at once.

Policy/Procedure Manual

#### Procedure:

#### 1. Show-ups

The use of show-ups should be avoided whenever possible in preference to the use of a lineup or photo array procedure. However, when circumstances require the prompt presentation of a suspect to a witness, the following guidelines shall be followed to minimize potential suggestiveness and increase reliability.

- a. Document the witness's description of the perpetrator prior to conducting the show up.
- b. Conduct a show-up only when the suspect is detained within a reasonably time frame after the commission of the offense and within a close physical proximity to the location of the crime.
- c. Do not use a show-up procedure if probable cause to arrest the suspect has already been established.
- d. If possible, avoid conducting a show-up when the suspect is in a patrol car, handcuffed, or physically restrained by officers, unless safety concerns make this impractical.
- e. Caution the witness that the person he or she is about to see may or may not be the perpetrator—and it is equally important to clear an innocent person. The witness should also be advised that the investigation will continue regardless of the outcome of the show-up.
- f. Do not conduct the show-up with more than one witness present at a time.
- g. Separate witnesses and do not allow communication between them before or after conducting a show-up.
- h. If one witness identifies the suspect, use a line-up or photo array for remaining witnesses.
- i. Do not present the same suspect to the same witness more than once.
- j. Do not require show-up suspects to put on clothing worn by, speak words uttered by, or perform other actions of the perpetrator.
- k. Officers should scrupulously avoid words or conduct of any type that may suggest to the witness that the individual is or may be the perpetrator.
- 1. Ask the witness to provide a confidence statement.
- m. Remind the witness not to talk about the show-up to other witnesses until police or prosecutors deem it permissible.
- n. Videotape the identification process using an in-car camera or other recording device when feasible.
- o. Document the time and location of the show-up, the officers present, the result of the procedure, and any other relevant information.

Policy/Procedure Manual

#### Line-up and Photo Array Procedures

- 1. Basic Procedures for Conducting a Line-up or Photo Array
  - a. Line-ups will not typically be utilized for investigations, unless conducting a photo array is not possible.
  - b. Whenever possible, a blind presentation shall be utilized. In cases where a blind presentation is not feasible for a photo array, a blinded presentation should be used. Live line-ups must be conducted using a blind presentation.
  - c. The line-up or photo array should consist of a minimum of six individuals or photographs. Use a minimum of five fillers and only one suspect.
  - d. Fillers should be reasonably similar in age, height, weight, and general appearance and be of the same sex and race, in accordance with the witness's description of the offender.
  - e. Avoid the use of fillers who so closely resemble the suspect that a person familiar with the suspect might find it difficult to distinguish the suspect from the fillers.
  - f. Create a consistent appearance between the suspect and the fillers with respect to any unique or unusual feature (e.g., scars, tattoos, facial hair) used to describe the perpetrator by artificially adding or concealing that feature on the fillers.
  - g. If there is more than one suspect, include only one in each line-up or photo array.
  - h. During a blind presentation, no one who is aware of the suspect's identity should be present during the administration of the photo array. However, during a line-up, the suspect's attorney should be present.
  - i. Place suspects in different positions in each line-up or photo array, both across cases and with multiple witnesses in the same case.
  - j. Witnesses should not be permitted to see or be shown any photos of the suspect prior to the line-up or photo array.
  - k. The witness shall be given a copy of the following instructions prior to viewing the line-up or photo array and the administrator shall read the instructions aloud before the identification procedure.

You will be asked to look at a series of individuals.

The perpetrator may or may not be present in the identification procedure.

It is just as important to clear innocent persons from suspicion as it is to identify guilty parties.

I don't know whether the person being investigated is included in this series.

Sometimes a person may look different in a photograph than in real life because of different hair styles, facial hair, glasses, a hat or other changes in appearance. Keep in mind that how a photograph was taken or developed may make a person's complexion look lighter or darker than in real life.

You should not feel that you have to make an identification. If you do identify someone, I will ask you to describe in your own words how certain you are,

#### Policy/Procedure Manual

The individuals are not configured in any particular order.

If you make an identification, I will continue to show you the remaining individuals or photos in the series.

Regardless of whether you make an identification, we will continue to investigate the incident.

Since this is an ongoing investigation, you should not discuss the identification procedures or results

- 1. The line-up or photo array should be shown to only one witness at a time; officers should separate witnesses so they will not be aware of the responses of other witnesses.
- m. Multiple identification procedures should not be conducted in which the same witness views the same suspect more than once.
- n. Officers should scrupulously avoid the use of statements, cues, casual comments, or providing unnecessary or irrelevant information that in any manner may influence the witnesses' decision-making process or perception.
- o. Following an identification, the administrator shall ask the witness to provide a confidence statement and document the witness's response.
- p. The administrator shall ask the witness to complete and sign an Eyewitness Identification Procedure Form.
- q. Line-up and photo array procedures should be video or audio recorded whenever possible. If a procedure is not recorded, a written record shall be created and the reason for not recording shall be documented. In the case of line-ups that are not recorded, agents shall take and preserve a still photograph of each individual in the line-up.

#### 2. Photographic Arrays

- a. Creating a Photo Array
  - 1. Use contemporary photos.
  - 2. Do not mix color and black and white photos.
  - 3. Use photos of the same size and basic composition.
  - 4. Never mix mug shots with other photos and ensure consistent appearance of photograph backgrounds and sizing.
  - 5. Do not include more than one photo of the same suspect.
  - 6. Cover any portions of mug shots or other photos that provide identifying information on the subject and similarly cover other photos used in the array.
  - 7. Where the suspect has a unique feature, such as a scar, tattoo, or mole or distinctive clothing that would make him or her stand out in the photo array, filler photographs should include that unique feature either by selecting fillers who have the same features themselves or by altering the photographs of fillers to the extent necessary to achieve a consistent appearance.
  - 8. Fillers should not be reused in arrays for different suspects shown to the same witness.
- b. Conducting the Photo Array
  - 1. The photo array should be preserved, together with full information about the identification process as part of the case file and documented in a report.
  - 2. If a blind administrator is not available, the administrator shall ensure that a blinded presentation is conducted using the following procedures.
    - a. Place the suspect and at least five filler photos in separate folders for a total of six (or more depending on the number of fillers used).

#### Policy/Procedure Manual

- b. The administrator will take one folder containing a known filler and place it to the side. This will be the first photo in the series. The administrator should then shuffle the remaining folders (containing one suspect and the remainder of fillers) such that he or she cannot see how the line-up members are ordered. These shuffled folders will follow the first filler photo. The stack of photos is now ready to be shown to the witness.
- c. The administrator should position himself or herself so that he or she cannot see inside the folders as they are viewed by the witness.
- 3. The witness should be asked if he or she recognizes the person in the photo before moving onto the next photo. If an identification is made before all of the photos are shown, the administrator should tell the witness that he or she must show the witness all of the photos and finish showing the sequence to the witness, still asking after each photo if the witness recognizes the person in the photo.
- 4. If possible, the array should be shown to the witness only once. If, upon viewing the entire array the witness asks to see a particular photo or the entire array again, the witness should be instructed that he or she may view the entire array only one additional time. If a second viewing is permitted, it must be documented.

#### 3. Line-ups

- a. Conducting the Line-up
  - 1. Live line-ups shall be conducted using a blind administrator.
  - Ensure that all persons in the line-up are numbered consecutively and are referred to only by number,
- b. The primary investigating officer is responsible for the following:
  - 1. Scheduling the line-up on a date and at a time that is convenient for all concerned parties, to include the prosecuting attorney, defense counsel, and any witnesses.
  - 2. Ensuring compliance with any legal requirements for transfer of the subject to the line-up location if he or she is incarcerated at a detention center.
  - 3. Making arrangements to have persons act as fillers.
  - 4. Ensuring that the suspect's right to counsel is scrupulously honored and that he or she is provided with counsel if requested. Obtaining proper documentation of any waiver of the suspect's right to counsel.
  - 5. Allowing counsel representing the suspect sufficient time to confer with his or her client prior to the line-up and to observe the manner in which the line-up is conducted.

Policy/Procedure Manual

#### 2200.5.4 PART-TIME OFFICER EVALUATIONS

Part-time officers having completed their field training will be evaluated annually using performance dimensions applicable to the duties and authorities granted to that part-time officer.

#### 2200.6 TRAINING REQUIREMENTS

Part-time officers are required to meet the training requirements applicable to full-time licensed officers as outlined in the Training Policy.

#### 2200.7 COMPLIANCE

Part-time officers shall be required to adhere to all department policies and procedures. A copy of the policies and procedures will be made available to each part-time officer upon appointment.

The officers shall become thoroughly familiar with these policies.

Whenever a rule, regulation or guideline in this Policy Manual refers to a regular fulltime police officer, it shall also apply to a part-time officer, unless by its nature it is inapplicable.

Part-time officers are required by this department to meet department-approved training requirements.

All part-time officers are required to attend scheduled meetings. Any absences must be satisfactorily explained to the part-time officer coordinator.

#### 2200.8 Mandated Shift Requirement

All part-time officers shall be required to work a minimum of 2 shifts of per month minimum of 8 hours per shift; unless otherwise approved by the Chief.

The city's Wastewater Regionalization Project has received funding through the bonding bill adopted by the legislature in October, 2020. The project has also achieved eligibility for grants and low interest loans administered by the Public Facility Authority (PFA). Plans and specifications are required to be submitted to the MPCA for review and approval. As a result of the city's funding position, Bolton & Menk, Inc. recommends proceeding with the project design to secure the PFA dollars.

Design of the project involves multiple tasks prior to the plans and specifications being approved by the MPCA. Those tasks include the following:

- Preliminary Design and Survey
- Easement Acquisition
- Final Design
- MPCA Submittal
- Bidding Services

Following plan approval by the MPCA, Bidding Services will also be necessary.

The following is a summary of the scope and estimated fees associated with design engineering services.

#### **Preliminary Design**

Preliminary design services include:

- Data collection including survey, existing conditions, and utility locations
- Preliminary layouts and design associated with the forcemain, fiber conduit, lift stations, and odor control/flow monitoring structures
- Correspondence with private utility companies regarding potential conflicts and services needed for lift stations and other structures.
- Identification of permits required for the project and the processing of the required applications
- Wetland Delineation and required applications

#### **Easement Acquisition**

Although every effort will be made to locate the improvements within existing roadway right-of-ways and easements, permanent and temporary easements are anticipated for the project. Based on the Preliminary Design, we will identify the easements required, prepare exhibits, and meet with the affected property owners to discuss the project and necessary easements. We will assist the city with obtaining easements prior to construction.

Geotechnical investigation costs will be determined during Preliminary Design to ensure that soil boring information is obtained in appropriate locations.

We propose to provide a separate proposal for construction related services after bids are received and all funding has been secured.

For the past several months I have been researching different police squad cars for our next year purchase. This new squad car will replace the 2012 Chevy Tahoe. In the past year we have done a lot of repairs to this vehicle to keep it running. I honestly am not sure how much longer we can keep this vehicle running without putting more money into this vehicle.

Attached you will find quotes for the Chevy Tahoe and Ford Utility. These quotes are from Hibbing Chevrolet and Tenvoorde Ford for they hold the State Bid for squad cars. I have also spoke with Chad Murphy from Murphy Chevrolet here in town and his quote is listed below for the same specs listed on the State Bid Chevrolet Tahoe.

- Majority of the equipment in the 2012 squad car can transport over to the 2021 Tahoe, but not the Ford Utility.
- I will be looking to trade in the old squad car to whomever we purchase the new one from.

I would recommend Council approve the purchase of the 2021 Tahoe purchase through Murphy Chevrolet for 37,500. It is \$126.34 more than the State Bid; however, I know the importance of shopping local and supporting our local businesses. Murphy Chevrolet often comes and picks up our squads when needed so then we do not have to worry about having to somehow drop the car off for repairs/warrant work. Murphy Chevrolet is always quick in getting our vehicles in for service.

Also if we would purchase the Chevrolet Tahoe from State Bid two officers will have to drive up to Hibbing to pick up the squad and drive back the new squad. This would be approximately 5.5 hours round trip. If I was able to get part timers to do this the cost in just their wages would be at least \$198.00. If a full time officer would go it would cost more. I estimate the cost of fuel would be around \$60, plus additional mileage on our vehicles. If we would purchase the Tahoe from Murphy Chevrolet the vehicle will be delivered to right here in town and will save the City money in the end with not having to have to pay two officers wages and fuel.

Per Chad Murphy it would take about 90-120 days to receive the vehicle if all goes well.


SRF has come up with some preliminary lighting costs for the TH 23 project in Foley. The stand MnDOT lighting is estimated to be \$314,300 and the decorative option is estimated to be \$476,200. Using those numbers, an estimate for the City of Foley's portion of the lighting cost would be \$157,150 (50% of standard cost) for standard lighting and \$319,050 (50% of standard lighting plus 100% of cost above standard) for decorative lighting.

This letter is to advise you of the impending improvements on Minnesota State Highway 23 in the cities of Foley, Ronneby, Oak Park and Foreston. The purpose of this project is to improve traffic flow by adding additional turn lanes, pedestrian sidewalks, and a roundabout at Eighth Avenue/Penn Street in Foley. The project also includes 12.5 miles of new asphalt surface from 13<sup>th</sup> Avenue in Foley to the Rum River in Milaca, including new turn lanes, underground pipes and guardrail. 



### Consent Agenda

A number of routine items are on the consent agenda and I will highlight some of the less common items we are used to seeing.

### **CARES Act Resolution**

This resolution summarizes expenditures we have to date. We still anticipate a few other things may trickle in the next few days. The resolution is provided to protect the City in case of audit and provides the council reasonings for approving the purchases.

### Fire Rescue Truck

The fire department is recommending proceeding with the high bid of \$4,000 for the old rescue truck. This is lower than we had hoped but based on further research is likely the best we will get. Please contact Mark Pappenfus should you have further questions.

Police Department Policy Updates

A number of these policy updates are requirements from the state. We have also added some clarification on the training requirements as well as a recommendation to a new minimum to work 2 shifts per month for part-time officers. The personnel committee has met and is recommending approval of these policy updates.

Police Part-Time Hiring Process

The personnel committee is also recommending starting another hiring process to make a new eligibility list for part-time officers. We will need to hire one right away and would have the list available for future needs. The final recommendation will come back to the council for approval.

Public Hearing - Snow/Weeds Assessments

The council will need to hold a public hearing in order to certify charges for snow and weeds. The resolution and exhibit with totals are in your packet. Please note, we will remove any payments that are made following adoption at the council meeting but prior to the deadline to certify at the county.

Foley Wastewater Project Update

With the passing of the bonding bill and funding of Foley's project we have many items to address in the coming months. The first item I will ask the council address is a resolution applying for a grant from the MN Public Facilities Authority. They will be administering all our state grant funding (direct appropriation and PSIG) and also likely provide us a low interest loan for whatever is remaining. The resolution is needed in order to set up an agreement for the process.

Jared Voge from Bolton & Menk will also be at the meeting to present the final design costs and update the council on the timeline. Please keep in mind that we have already completed an RFP process where we selected Bolton as our design engineer. Design costs were also included in our estimated project

costs. We will be approving the design by resolution indicating we intend to reimburse ourselves by all potential funding (grant & loan) sources.

Mark & I also participated in a meeting this week with the City of St. Cloud and the other area cities who use the wastewater facility. Everything is still moving forward to provide Foley with the needed capacity and connection in 2022 (estimated project completion). We also have an updated connection cost at this time of \$6.4 million.

Lastly, I can provide an update on the fiber meeting we held last week. There is still a lot of interest in completing this work in coordination with the pipe work. I can explain more at the meeting.

Police Squad Car Replacement

Chief McMillin has provided squad car quotes in your council packet. There is a significant lead time with this equipment purchase and the chief has outlined a couple state bid options as well as an option to purchase locally. This item is within the 2021 capital budget and has been discussed with the council at prior meetings due to the issues we are having with the current squad.

Highway 23 Project

I have two items to discuss with the council regarding the upcoming Highway 23 project. The first is in regards to a property acquisition the state would like to make on the corner of Highway 23 and Penn Street. This is the intersection of the proposed roundabout. The state would like to confirm the city's intent to release this property and also if there is a desire to donate it or if they should proceed with the option of MnDOT purchasing from us. The current county value of it is about \$18,000.

The second item is an update on lighting costs expected of the City. I have included an email with costs and a diagram to give you an idea of the look. Please keep in mind we do have funding coming from the state to help with some of these costs (from prior bonding bill). We have priced out a simple lighting option but with the ability to add a banner and outlet. We can discuss it further at the meeting.

Discussion on Meeting Room/City Hall Access

We have brought back some groups into the meeting room and so far the cleaning has been going fine. I would not recommend expanding upon this further at this time due to the rising cases in our county. I also want to bring to the council's attention that a number of cities are either pulling back on in-person meetings and limiting hours to city halls because of these rising case counts. It is possible we could see some action from the state in the near future that may impact some of these items. I will keep an eye on what other areas are doing and work with the mayor on if we need to make any quick adjustments.
