CITY OF FOLEY, MINNESOTA CITY COUNCIL MEETING – December 1, 2020

The Foley City Council held a regular meeting on December 1, 2020, at 5:30 p.m. at the Foley City Hall.

Members Present: Mayor Gerard Bettendorf, Councilmembers Jeff Gondeck, Rosalie Musachio, and Gary Swanson.

Members Absent: None

The pledge of allegiance was recited.

Motion by Swanson, seconded by Gondeck, to approve the agenda. Motion carried, unanimous.

Consent Agenda

Motion by Gondeck, seconded by Musachio, to approve the consent agenda, which includes the following:

- Approve minutes of Nov. 10 & 13, 2020.
- Approve Proclamation School Choice Week.
- Approve payment of bills.

Motion carried, unanimous.

S.E.H. - Smoke Testing Report

Jarod Griffith, City Engineer filling in for Jon Halter, gave an overview to the council of the results of the I&I sewer study last spring. The full report was included in the council packet. The flow monitoring and sewer testing focused on the two primary sewer districts feeding into Broadway Avenue and Birch Drive. The meters recorded five major rain events. The results showed that I&I issues are improving, but there are still areas of concern. Table 3 and 4 showed the wet to dry ratio of the city's wastewater is double during rain events. Roughly 70% of the I&I flow is in the Broadway Avenue lift station district. Next step is to develop a manhole repair plan to fix defects. Discussion and questions from the council followed. No cost estimates for recommended projects at this time. These will be brought back to the council for consideration in the spring.

Mayor's Comments & Open Forum

No one spoke.

Department Reports

Foley Police Department

Chief Katie McMillin gave an overview of the November call report. The department received 265 calls in November. Equipment violations were up (taillights and headlights) while animal complaints were down. Winter Parking is now in effect as of Nov. 1. Twenty-five parking tickets were issued after reminders were posted on the city's social media. Warnings were given for the first week in November before tickets were issued. The department received eight applications for the part-time officer position. The review and hiring process will be postponed until January.

City Engineer

Jarod Griffith, city engineer, gave the council an update and overview of possible 2022 projects. The lift station at 11th Avenue and force main would be removed down to Penn Street. The project is estimated at \$248,949.45. The utility improvement project to extend gravity sewer to Lord Avenue is estimated at \$150,255. Discussion and questions followed. If the council wishes to proceed these improvements would be done in coordination with the 2022 highway project. The council also asked further questions regarding the lighting on the Hwy 23 roundabout project.

Public Works and Fire Department

Mark Pappenfus gave an update to the council on the purchase of a new sewer vac truck and directed the council to the materials in their packet. The 2020 budget includes \$360,000 for the purchase of a new truck. Pappenfus said he'd found a used 2017 truck in good condition that looked promising and might be available after Jan. 1. Pappenfus asked the council for a motion to allow staff to evaluate the truck and sign a purchase agreement for \$300,000 (less the trade in for the existing vehicle) if the truck passed inspection. Motion by Gondeck, seconded by Swanson, to authorize staff to review the vehicle and sign a purchase agreement with the understanding it would come back to the council to approve the expenditure. Motion carried, unanimous. Pappenfus said there were no updates from the fire department at this time other than that accidents were way down in November.

Administration

City Administrator Sarah Brunn asked the council if there were any questions regarding the 2021 meeting schedule provided in the council packet. She also directed the council to her performance review questionnaire and evaluation sheet included in the packet and asked for the council's feedback. Brunn also reminded the council they would be discussing the sewer rate ordinance next month. Brunn also reported the Cares money reporting was completed and sent to the state. The county also approved and released a non-profit grant list on Monday. The 4th Avenue N art mural is now complete.

Old Business

Brunn gave the council an update on the Orderly Annexation and Joint Planning agreement with Gilmanton Township. Brunn would attend the township meeting after the city council meeting and would report back to the council.

Public Hearing - Truth in Taxation Hearing

Mayor Bettendorf recessed the regular city council meeting at 6:08 p.m. to conduct a public hearing on the 2021 budget.

Brunn explained the levy increase for the 2021 budget was minimal. It would amount to a 1.05% increase, which was less than the city's projected tax base growth of 4%.

Josh Coder, 220 2nd Avenue, asked who evaluated property values in the city. Brunn explained the county assessor determined property values.

The City recognized there may have been an issue with the delivery of the proposed tax notices by the county auditor-treasurer and did extra notification of the TNT hearing via the city's social media pages and word of mouth. The City decided to move ahead with passing of the levy due to a concern about holding any additional meetings due to a significant spike in COVID-19 cases in the local community.

The meeting was also recorded and made available for public to view on the city website and social media pages.

The regular city council meeting was reconvened at 6:12 p.m.

Motion by Gondeck, seconded by Musachio, to adopt Resolution #2020-35 Tax Levy 2021.

Motion carried, unanimous.

At 6:13 p.m. Mayor Bettendorf closed the meeting per Minn. Stat. 13D.05 Subd. 3(c) 13D.05 – for discussion on potential land price of PID 020049300 & PID 020050000.

At 6:32 the meeting reconvened.

Motion by Gondeck, seconded by Swanson to adjourn. Motion carried, unanimous.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 453

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE FOLEY CITY ORDINANCES CHAPTER VI, SECTION 610 SEWER RATES AND CHARGES

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FOLEY HEREBY ORDAINS that the 1974 Code of Ordinances of the City of Foley CHAPTER VI, FEES, CHARGES and RATES be amended:

The existing Section 610:00 Sewer Rates and Charges Subd. 3, and Subd. 5 are repealed, substituting therefore the following Section 610:00 Subd. 3 and Subd. 5, to read as follows:

Section 610:00 Sewer Rates and Charges Established.
Subd. 3. The following quarterly sewage service charges and rates be, and the same hereby are continued as heretofore adopted, for usage of the municipal sewage service:
(a) Minimum for up to 7,000 gallons\$53.20
(b) Excess over 7,000 gallons\$00.76 per 100 gallons or portion thereof.
Subd. 5. Effective date of Sewer Rates. The sewer rates described above shall take effect on January 1, 2021.







This application is tentatively scheduled for the December 14th planning commission meeting for review. This will also need to be addressed by Gilmanton Township as well.

I'd appreciate your comments by email no later November 30th. I'd like to be able to communicate our findings with Gilmanton Township prior to their meeting that week.

Adam -I will need you to verify that this easement is valid and will still remain in place with this change. Are there any other actions required to retain it?



First, the easement encumbers the land that is described in the legal descriptions of the easement, regardless of who owns the land or how it is divided. Second, the text of the easement is enforceable and it is recorded, so I don't have concerns about its validity. There is nothing the City needs to do to "keep" the easement. The only thing I don't know is the exact location of the easement based on the survey.

I cannot tell if the survey accurately shows the easement or not. The drawing shows the south section line of section 26, but I cannot tell where the ½ ½ lines are between the SE ½ NW ¼ and the NE ¼ SW ¼ and the .NW ¼ and NE ¼. The red dashed line in the attached seems to roughly depict an area 33' x223', but I cannot tell where it is within the SE ¼. I need to see more information on the survey. The narrative on the ft hand side of the survey seems consistent with the 1959 easement.

Based on Beacon, it looks like the ¾¼ line is the property line with the corner in the middle of Norman, so it looks like the survey is probably right. We may need a surveyor to confirm. If the City is not going to vacate the easement, it may not matter unless someone is planning to build in or right up to the easement. I am happy to discuss further.



DRAINAGE AND UTILITY EASEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, is made effective January 5, 2021, between Conrad Towne and Arlys Towne, wife and husband ("Towne"); and Rebecca Howard and Thomas Howard, wife and husband ("Howard") (collectively "Grantors"); and the City of Foley, Minnesota ("City").

RECITALS.

- **A.** Grantors are the owners of the following described real property located in Foley, Minnesota as described in **Exhibit A** ("Property").
- **B.** As part of an effort to clean up a boundary line between the Grantors, Grantors wish to vacate a dedicated but unconstructed road and are willing to grant a permanent drainage and utility easement as a condition of approval of the vacation request.
- **C.** The parties desire to create easements for drainage and utilities.
- **NOW, THEREFORE,** for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:
- 1. <u>Easement</u>. Grantors hereby grant and convey to the City, a perpetual easement (the "Permanent Easement") for utility purposes over, under and across the Property as described and depicted in **Exhibit B** (the "Easement Area"). The Permanent Easement includes the right of the City, its contractors, agents, and employees to enter the Easement Area at all reasonable times for the purposes of laying, constructing, operating, inspecting, altering, repairing, replacing, or maintaining drainage and utility infrastructure.
- 2. <u>No Obstructions.</u> No fences or other structures over, under, on, through, across, or within the Easement Area shall be constructed, nor shall any obstruction be placed over, under, on, through, across or within the Easement Area. The City or its assigns may remove any unauthorized obstruction. Existing vegetation shall be allowed to remain, but the City may remove vegetation without compensation if necessary to complete work in the Easement Area.
- 3. <u>Warranty of Title</u>. Grantors warrant that they are the respective owners of the Property and have the right, title and capacity to convey the Easement to the City.

- 4. <u>Grantors' Use of Easement Area</u>. Grantors retain the right to use the Easement Area for uses not inconsistent with the rights granted to the City.
- 5. <u>Binding Effect</u>. This Agreement and the Permanent Easement created by this Agreement shall continue in full force and effect in perpetuity. The Permanent Easement shall be considered to run with the land and burden the Grantors and their successors and assigns.
- **6.** <u>Modification</u>. This Agreement may not be modified except by the express written consent of the City.







Consent Agenda

We have another part-time police officer resigning. The personnel committee has started the hiring process for a new eligibility list and will be interviewing on January 11th.

The fire department is requesting an appointment of a new lieutenant as there was a vacancy because of a resignation. The recommendation is in your packet.

The fire department is also recommending some clarifications and changes to the fire compensation policy. The personnel committee has reviewed and recommends approval.

2021 Annual Appointments

The list of appointments is in your packet. We still have vacancies on a number of boards. There is always an option of appointing an interested party in the middle of year. A couple things to note:

- Planning commission only has 4 members I do not recommend we continue with 2 council and 2 community I'd recommend another community member or dropping one councilmember.
- EDA also has a similar situation and it would probably be best to follow the same situation as planning.

Fee Schedule – Sewer Rate Ordinance

Following the public hearing the council should move adoption of the provided ordinance. This implements the 10% rate increase for sewer provided for in the 2021 budget. No water rate increase occurred this year.

Vacation of City Right-of-Way

We received an application for a lot split between Conrad Towne and Thomas Howard. The split brought into question a strip of property the city has deeded in between the houses for a road. City staff reviewed and indicated a road would not likely be built but utilities may potentially be run in the future. Staff recommended proceeding with a vacation of the road right-of-way and replacing it instead with a utility easement. Public hearing notices were sent and the city council should address this item before addressing the subdivision request. Information is found in your packet. Staff can also provide more detail at the meeting.

Minor Subdivision Request - Towne/Howard

Following the vacation and easement items the council can then address the lot split. Information is in your packet.

Highway 23 - Utilities/Lift Station Work

City staff overviewed potential utility work to be done in conjunction with the Highway 23 work in 2022. Staff would like the council to make a decision on that project so we can plan accordingly on how it will be implemented within the larger project.

Highway 23 Lighting

Staff will also again discuss the lighting options for the 2022 project and hope to finalize a decision on what to include in the plans.

Amended Debt Service Schedule

I have been working on financial applications for our sewer project funding. Part of this process involves us taking a hard look to ensure we are charging our utility funds appropriately for costs. This will help make sure our rate structure moving forward is adequate. In reviewing our existing debt, I found some of our older debt (2008 Bonds – refunded in 2012 & 2020) did not allocate enough charges for utility costs from big projects to the utility funds. I went back and reviewed the original project quantities and updated our repayments schedules to a include this larger charge to the utility fund. I'm asking you to approve these amendments to the budget. This is not changing our payment, only reducing the liability of the general tax levy and shifting more to the enterprise fund. This is the most accurate way to account for the actual cost of the infrastructure provided to the sewer fund.

Orderly Annexation Agreement

There is not change with the annexation agreement but I will be stopping in to the township meeting following our meeting on Tuesday.
