This Agreement is between the State of Minnesota, acting through its Commissioner of Transportation ("State") and the City of Foley acting through its City Council ("City").

Recitals

- 1. The State will perform grading, bituminous milling and surfacing, roundabout, lighting, ADA improvements, Bridge No. 05X01, and No. 05X06 construction and other associated construction upon, along, and adjacent to Trunk Highway No. 23 from Broadway Avenue South to the Rum River according to State-prepared plans, specifications, and special provisions designated by the City and the State as State Project No. 005-090-002 and by State as State Project No. 0504-20 (T.H. 23=023) ("Project"); and
- 2. The City has requested the State include in its Project trail, lighting and utility construction; and
- 3. The City wishes to participate in the costs of the trail, lighting, and utility construction and associated
- 4. The City requests that it perform certain aspects of the construction engineering in connection with the water main, sanitary sewer, and fiber optic construction and the State concurs in that request; and
- 5. The eligible City participation construction will be reduced by the amount of General Obligation ("GO") Bond funding and Federal aid funding received for said construction; and
- 6. Agreement 1036471 between the State and Bay West, LLC, will address the cost of construction oversight of contaminated materials for City and State participation construction; and
- 7. Separate agreements between the State and Benton County, and between the State and Mille Lacs County will address Trunk Highway detours; and
- 8. Minnesota Statutes § 161.45, subdivision 2, allows for City-owned utility relocation to be included in a State construction contract, and payment by the City for such relocation according to applicable statutes and rules
- 9. Minnesota Statutes § 161.20, subdivision 2 authorizes the Commissioner of Transportation to make arrangements with and cooperate with any governmental authority for the purposes of constructing, maintaining, and improving the trunk highway system.

Agreement

1. Term of Agreement; Survival of Terms; Plans; Incorporation of Exhibits

- **1.1.** *Effective Date.* This Agreement will be effective on the date the State obtains all signatures required by Minnesota Statutes § 16C.05, subdivision 2.
- 1.2. Expiration Date. This Agreement will expire when all obligations have been satisfactorily fulfilled.
- 1.3. Survival of Terms. All clauses which impose obligations continuing in their nature and which must survive in order to give effect to their meaning will survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement, including, without limitation, the following clauses: 3. Maintenance by the City; 8. Liability; Worker Compensation Claims; 11. State Audits; 12. Government Data Practices; 14. Governing Law; Jurisdiction; Venue; 15. State Bond Financed Property Restrictions and 16. Force Majeure.
- **1.4.** *Plans, Specifications, and Special Provisions.* Plans, specifications, and special provisions designated by the State as State Project No. 0504-20 (T.H. 23=023) are on file in the office of the Commissioner of Transportation at St. Paul, Minnesota, and incorporated into this Agreement by reference ("Project Plans").
- **1.5.** Exhibits. Preliminary Schedule "I" is on file in the office of the City Administrator and attached and incorporated into this Agreement. Exhibit A MMB Certification Form is attached and incorporated into this agreement.

2. Construction by the State

- **2.1.** Contract Award. The State will advertise for bids and award a construction contract to the lowest responsible bidder according to the Project Plans.
- 2.2. Direction, Supervision, and Inspection of Construction.
 - A. Supervision and Inspection by the State. The State will direct and supervise all construction activities performed under the construction contract, and except as provided below, perform all construction engineering and inspection functions in connection with the contract construction. All contract construction will be performed according to the Project Plans.
 - B. Construction Engineering and Inspection by the City. The City will assign its City Engineer or other registered professional engineer to perform construction engineering in connection with the water main, sanitary sewer, and fiber optic construction. The engineer so assigned will act under the supervision and direction of the State and be responsible for construction inspection, control of materials, staking and associated documentation for said construction. The construction will be performed according to the Project Plans and recognized and accepted practices and procedures as set forth in various State manuals, including Specifications No. 1601 through and including No. 1609 in the State's current "Standard Specifications for Construction". The City will furnish other personnel, services, supplies, and equipment needed to properly carry on the construction.
 - i. Documentation of Construction Costs. At regular intervals after the State's contractor has started the water main, sanitary sewer, and fiber optic construction, the City will prepare partial estimates of the construction costs according to the terms of the construction contract and immediately submit the partial estimates to the State. The City will also prepare the final estimate data for said construction and submit the final estimate to the State. Quantities listed on the partial and final estimates will be documented according to guidelines in the applicable documentation manual.
 - ii. Final Inspection of Construction. Upon completion of the water main, sanitary sewer, and fiber

optic construction, the City will advise the State whether or not said construction should be accepted by the State as being performed in a satisfactory manner. If the City recommends that the State not accept the construction, then the City will, as part of their recommendation, identify the specific defects in the construction and the reasons why it should not be accepted. Any recommendations made by the City are not binding on the State. The State will determine, after considering the City's recommendations, whether or not the construction has been properly performed and whether to accept or reject it.

iii. Inspection of Other City Participation Construction. The remainder of the City participation construction covered under this Agreement will be open to inspection by the City. If the City believes the City participation construction covered under this Agreement has not been properly performed or that the construction is defective, the City will inform the State District Engineer's authorized representative in writing of those defects. Any recommendations made by the City are not binding on the State. The State will have the exclusive right to determine whether the State's contractor has satisfactorily performed the City participation construction covered under this

2.3. Plan Changes, Additional Construction, Etc.

- A. The State will make changes in the Project Plans and contract construction, which may include the City participation construction covered under this Agreement, and will enter into any necessary addenda and change orders with the State's contractor that are necessary to cause the contract construction to be performed and completed in a satisfactory manner. The State District Engineer's authorized representative will inform the appropriate City official of any proposed addenda and change orders to the construction contract that will affect the City participation construction covered under this
- B. The City may request additional work or changes to the work in the plans as part of the construction contract. Such request will be made by an exchange of letter(s) with the State. If the State determines that the requested additional work or plan changes are necessary or desirable and can be accommodated without undue disruption to the project, the State will cause the additional work or
- 2.4. Satisfactory Completion of Contract. The State will perform all other acts and functions necessary to cause the construction contract to be completed in a satisfactory manner. 2.5. Permits.

- A. The City will submit to the State's Utility Engineer an original permit application for all utilities owned by the City to be constructed hereunder that are upon and within the Trunk Highway Right-of-Way. Applications for permits will be made on State form "Application For Utility Permit On Trunk Highway
- B. The City will submit to the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency the plans and specifications for the construction or reconstruction of its sanitary sewer facilities to be performed under the construction contract and obtain, under Minnesota Statutes § 115.07 or Minnesota Rules 7001.1030, subpart 2C, either a permit or written waiver from that agency for that construction or reconstruction. The City is advised that under Minnesota Rules 7001.1040, a written application for the permit or waiver must be submitted to the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency at least 180 days before the planned date of the sanitary sewer facility construction or reconstruction.

C. Limited Use Permit. The City will obtain, through the District's Right-of-Way Area Manager, a Limited Use Permit to cover the City's liability responsibilities of multi-use trail to be constructed upon the State Right-of-Way.

2.6. Replacement of Castings. Adjustments to certain City-owned facilities, including but not limited to, valve boxes and frame and ring castings, may be performed by the State's contractor under the construction contract. The City will furnish the contractor with new units and/or parts for those in place City-owned facilities when replacements are required and not covered by a contract pay item, without cost or expense to the State or the contractor, except for replacement of units and/or parts broken or damaged by the contractor.

3. Maintenance by the City

Upon completion of the project, the City will provide the following without cost or expense to the State:

3.1. Roundabout on T.H. 23.

- A. Roundabout Approaches. Maintenance of 8th Avenue and Penn Street approaches up to the curb line of the outer circle of the T.H. 23 roundabout. Maintenance includes, but is not limited to, snow, ice and debris removal, resurfacing, seal coating, and any other maintenance activities according to accepted City maintenance practices.
- **B.** Roundabout Circle. Maintenance of the roundabout circle on T.H. 23 at 8th Avenue and Penn Street. The State and City will provide for snow, ice and debris removal of the roadway portion of the roundabout circle in conjunction with ongoing maintenance activities of their respective roadway approaches to the roundabout circle. The State will provide for resurfacing, seal coating, and any other maintenance activities necessary to perpetuate the roadway portion of the roundabout circle in a safe and usable condition.
- C. Roundabout Landscaping. Maintenance of any landscaping in the T.H. 23 at 8th Avenue and Penn Street roundabout. Maintenance includes but is not limited to, vegetation control, litter and debris removal, removal and replacement of all dead or diseased plantings, and any other maintenance activities necessary to perpetuate the landscaping in a safe, usable, and aesthetically acceptable condition.
- **3.2. Storm Sewers.** Routine maintenance of any storm sewer facilities construction within City limits. Routine maintenance includes, but is not limited to, removal of sediment, debris, vegetation and ice from grates and catch basins, and any other maintenance activities necessary to preserve the facilities and to prevent conditions such as flooding, erosion, or sedimentation, this also includes informing the District Maintenance Engineer of any needed repairs.
- **3.3.** *Municipal Utilities.* Maintenance of any municipal-owned utilities construction, without cost or expense to the State.
- **3.4.** *Sidewalks.* Maintenance of any sidewalk construction, including stamped and colored concrete sidewalk (if any) and pedestrian ramps. Maintenance includes, but is not limited to, snow, ice and debris removal, patching, crack repair, panel replacement, cross street pedestrian crosswalk markings, vegetation control of boulevards (if any), and any other maintenance activities necessary to perpetuate the sidewalks in a safe, useable, and aesthetically acceptable condition.
- **3.5.** *Multi-use Trail.* Maintenance of any multi-use trail construction. Maintenance includes, but is not limited to, snow and ice control/removal, sweeping and debris removal, patching, crack repair, pavement

replacement, vegetation control, signing, pavement markings, and any other maintenance activities necessary to perpetuate the multi-use trail in a safe and usable condition.

- 3.6. Lighting. Maintenance and ownership of any lighting facilities construction on Feed Point "A". Maintenance of electrical lighting systems includes everything within the system, from the point of attachment to the power source or utility, to the last light on the feed point, including but not limited to re-lamping of lighting units or replacing of LED luminaires, repair or replacement of all damaged luminaire glassware, loose connections, luminaires when damaged or when ballasts fail, photoelectric control on luminaires, defective starter boards or drivers, damaged fuse holders, blown fuses, knocked down poles including wiring within the poles, damaged poles, pullboxes, underground wire, damaged foundations, equipment pad, installation of approved splices or replacement of wires, repair or extending of conduit, lighting cabinet maintenance including photoelectric cell, electrical distribution system, Gopher State One Call (GSOC) locates, and painting of poles and other equipment. The City will be responsible for the hook up cost and application to secure an adequate power supply to the service pad or pole and will pay all monthly electrical service expenses necessary to operate the lighting facility.
- 3.7. Additional Drainage. No party to this Agreement will drain any additional drainage volume into the storm sewer facilities constructed under the construction contract that was not included in the drainage for which the storm sewer facilities were designed, without first obtaining written permission to do so from the other party. The drainage areas served by the storm sewer facilities constructed under the construction contract are shown in a drainage area map, Exhibit "Drainage Area", which is on file in the office of the State's District Hydraulics Engineer at Baxter and is incorporated into this Agreement by
- 3.8. Future Responsibilities. Upon completion of the 9th Avenue construction, the City will accept full and total responsibility and all obligations and liabilities arising out of or by reason of the use, operation, maintenance, repair, and reconstruction of 9th Avenue and all of the 9th Avenue facilities constructed as part of this Agreement, without cost or expense to the State.
- 3.9. Release and Conveyance of Roadways. Upon completion of the 9th Avenue construction, the State will serve upon the City a "Notice of Release" placing that roadway portion under the jurisdiction of the City; and subsequent thereto, after all required documents have been prepared and processed, the State will convey to the City all right, title and interest of the State in that roadway portion. Upon receipt of that "Notice of Release", the City will become the road authority responsible for the roadway portion so

4. Basis of City Cost

- 4.1. Schedule "I". The Preliminary Schedule "I" includes all anticipated City participation construction items and the construction engineering cost share covered under this Agreement, and is based on engineer's estimated unit prices.
- 4.2. City Participation Construction. The City will participate in the following at the percentages indicated. The construction includes the City's proportionate share of item costs for mobilization, field office, field laboratory, and traffic control. It is anticipated that the GO Bond and Federal aid funding will be available to the City as defined below. The City may be billed for the match of their cost participation as shown on the Schedule "I". City costs will include an amount equal to all anticipated GO Bond and Federal aid funding not applied to the federally eligible City participation construction.
 - A. 100 Percent will be the City's rate of GO Bond cost participation in all of the roundabout construction up to the capped amount of \$200,000.00. The construction includes, but is not limited to, those construction items tabulated on Sheets No. 2 through No. 4 of the Preliminary Schedule "I".

- B. 100 Percent will be the City's rate of cost participation in all of the federally participating trail construction. The construction includes, but is not limited to, those construction items tabulated on Sheet No. 5 of the Preliminary Schedule "I". Federal aid TAP funds will be applied at a rate of 80 Percent up to the capped amount of \$400,000.00 and may be modified at the time of award. The City's general bond will be applied to the Federal aid match and the remaining construction cost up to the capped amount. The City's general bond is capped at \$300,000.00 for the construction covered under 4.2.B.
- C. 100 Percent will be the City's rate of cost participation in all of the sidewalk and pedestrian lighting construction. The construction includes, but is not limited to, those construction items tabulated on Sheet No. 6 of the Preliminary Schedule "I". The City's general bond will be applied up to the capped amount. The City's general bond is capped at \$300,000.00 for the construction covered under 4.2.B.
- D. 100 Percent will be the City's rate of cost participation in all of the utility construction. The construction includes, but is not limited to, those construction items tabulated on Sheets No. 7 through No. 9 of the Preliminary Schedule "I".
- 4.3. Construction Engineering Costs. The City will pay a construction engineering charge equal to 3 percent of the water main, sanitary sewer, and fiber optic construction covered under this Agreement. The City will pay a construction engineering charge equal to 8 percent of the remaining City participation construction covered under this Agreement.
- 4.4. Contaminated Materials and Oversight. Agreement 1036471 between the State and Bay West, LLC will address the oversight of contaminated materials during construction. The City will be responsible for the costs associated with the removal of contaminated materials from City participation construction, as itemized in the Schedule "I", and for the costs of construction oversight of contaminated materials for City participation construction. The City's estimated cost for construction oversight of contaminated materials
- 4.5. Plan Changes, Additional Construction, Etc. The City will share in the costs of construction contract addenda and change orders that are necessary to complete the City participation construction covered under this Agreement, including any City requested additional work and plan changes.
 - The State reserves the right to invoice the City for the cost of any additional City requested work and plan changes, construction contract addenda, change orders and associated construction engineering before the completion of the contract construction.
- 4.6. Liquidated Damages. All liquidated damages assessed the State's contractor in connection with the construction contract will result in a credit shared by each party in the same proportion as their total construction cost share covered under this Agreement is to the total contract construction cost before any deduction for liquidated damages.

5. City Cost and Payment by the City

5.1. City Cost. \$1,404,816.11 is the City's estimated share of the costs of the contract construction, including Federal aid and GO Bond funding, and the construction engineering cost share as shown in the Preliminary Schedule "I". The Preliminary Schedule "I" was prepared using estimated quantities and unit prices, and may include any credits or lump sum costs. Upon award of the construction contract, the State will prepare a Revised Schedule "I" based on construction contract unit prices, which will replace and supersede the Preliminary Schedule "I" as part of this Agreement.

- 5.2. Conditions of Payment. The City will pay the State the City's total estimated construction and construction engineering cost share, minus anticipated City Federal aid and GO Bond funding, as shown in the Revised Schedule "I", after the following conditions have been met:
 - A. Execution of this Agreement and transmittal to the City, including a copy of the Revised Schedule "I".
 - B. The City's receipt of a written request from the State for the advancement of funds.
- 5.3. Acceptance of the City's Cost and Completed Construction. The computation by the State of the amount due from the City will be final, binding and conclusive. Acceptance by the State of the completed contract construction will be final, binding, and conclusive upon the City as to the satisfactory completion of the contract construction.
- 5.4. Final Payment by the City. Upon completion of all contract construction, including construction oversight of contaminated materials covered in Agreement 1036471, computation of the final amount due the State's contractor, successful transfer of GO Bond, and determination by the Federal Highway Administration of the amount of its reimbursement to the State, the State will prepare a Final Schedule "I" and submit a copy to the City. The Final Schedule "I" will be based on final quantities, and include all City participation construction items and the construction engineering cost share covered under this Agreement. The Final Schedule "I" may also include City costs in an amount equal to all Federal aid funding not applied to the federally eligible City participation construction. If the final cost of the City participation construction exceeds the amount of funds advanced by the City, the City will pay the difference to the State without interest. If the final cost of the City participation construction is less than the amount of funds advanced by the City, the State will refund the difference to the City without interest.

The State and the City waive claims for any payments or refunds less than \$5.00 according to Minnesota

6. Authorized Representatives

Each party's Authorized Representative is responsible for administering this Agreement and is authorized to give and receive any notice or demand required or permitted by this Agreement.

7. Assignment; Amendments; Waiver; Contract Complete

7.1. Assignment. No party may assign or transfer any rights or obligations under this Agreement without the prior consent of the other party and a written assignment agreement, executed and approved by the same parties who executed and approved this Agreement, or their successors in office.

- 7.2. Amendments. Any amendment to this Agreement must be in writing and will not be effective until it has been executed and approved by the same parties who executed and approved the original Agreement, or
- 7.3. Waiver. If a party fails to enforce any provision of this Agreement, that failure does not waive the provision or the party's right to subsequently enforce it.
- 7.4. Contract Complete. This Agreement contains all prior negotiations and agreements between the State and the City. No other understanding regarding this Agreement, whether written or oral, may be used to bind

8. Liability; Worker Compensation Claims

- 8.1. Each party is responsible for its own acts, omissions, and the results thereof to the extent authorized by law and will not be responsible for the acts and omissions of others and the results thereof. Minnesota Statutes § 3.736 and other applicable law govern liability of the State. Minnesota Statutes Chapter 466 and other applicable law govern liability of the City.
- 8.2. Each party is responsible for its own employees for any claims arising under the Workers Compensation

9. Nondiscrimination

Provisions of Minnesota Statutes § 181.59 and of any applicable law relating to civil rights and discrimination are considered part of this Agreement.

10. State Audits

Under Minnesota Statutes § 16C.05, subdivision 5, the City's books, records, documents, accounting procedures, and practices relevant to this Agreement are subject to examination by the State and the State Auditor or Legislative Auditor, as appropriate, for a minimum of six years from the end of this Agreement.

11. Government Data Practices

The City and State must comply with the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, Minnesota Statutes Chapter 13, as it applies to all data provided under this Agreement, and as it applies to all data created, collected, received, stored, used, maintained, or disseminated by the City under this Agreement. The civil remedies of Minnesota Statutes §13.08 apply to the release of the data referred to in this clause by either the

12. Telecommunications Certification

By signing this agreement, the City certifies that, consistent with Section 889 of the John S. McCain National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2019, Pub. L. 115-232 (Aug. 13, 2018), and 2 CFR 200.216, the City will not use funding covered by this agreement to procure or obtain, or to extend, renew, or enter into any contract to procure or obtain, any equipment, system, or service that uses "covered telecommunications equipment or services" (as that term is defined in Section 889 of the Act) as a substantial or essential component of any system or as critical technology as part of any system. The City will include this certification as a flow down clause in any contract related to this agreement.

13. Governing Law; Jurisdiction; Venue

Minnesota law governs the validity, interpretation, and enforcement of this Agreement. Venue for all legal proceedings arising out of this Agreement, or its breach, must be in the appropriate state or federal court with competent jurisdiction in Ramsey County, Minnesota.

14. Termination; Suspension

- 14.1. By Mutual Agreement. This Agreement may be terminated by mutual agreement of the parties.
- **14.2.** *Termination for Insufficient Funding.* The State may immediately terminate this Agreement if it does not obtain funding from the Minnesota Legislature, or other funding source; or if funding cannot be continued at a level sufficient to allow for the performance of contract construction under the Project. Termination must be by written or fax notice to the City.
- **14.3.** Suspension. In the event of a total or partial government shutdown, the State may suspend this Agreement and all work, activities and performance of work authorized through this Agreement.

15. State Bond Financed Property Restrictions

15.1. MMB Certification. Upon execution of this Agreement, the City will complete and file the certification form that is attached to this agreement as Exhibit A with the Commissioner of Management and Budget.

The portions of the Project that are funded by State of Minnesota general obligation bonds, are not needed for the trunk highway, and are therefore not part of the State's trunk highway system. The City and the State acknowledge that due to the use of the general obligation bonds to fund the Project, the Commissioner of Minnesota Management and Budget ("MMB") has certain rights in the Project as set forth in that certain Fourth Order Amending Order of Commissioner of Finance Relating to Use and Sale of State Bond Financed Property executed by the Commissioner of Minnesota Management and Budget and dated July 30, 2012, as amended. MMB's interest under the certification form that is attached to this agreement as Exhibit A extends for 37.5 years, as measured from the date of substantial completion of the Project. City will own the non-trunk highway portions of the Project within the Area as the Road Authority pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Chapter 160.

16. Force Majeure

No party will be responsible to the other for a failure to perform under this Agreement (or a delay in performance), if such failure or delay is due to a force majeure event. A force majeure event is an event beyond a party's reasonable control, including but not limited to, unusually severe weather, fire, floods, other acts of God, labor disputes, acts of war or terrorism, or public health emergencies.

BY THIS CONTRACT, the City of Foley, Minnesota, and the Township of <u>Gilmanton</u>, County of <u>Benton</u>, Minnesota, hereinafter respectively to as the City and the Town, agree with each other as indicated by the following articles:

Article I. This agreement covers the following geographic area:

All of Gilmanton Township

Article II. The City agrees to furnish fire service and fire protection, to all property within the Town area covered by this contract, for the compensation and on the conditions hereinafter set forth, and the City further agrees that a reasonable effort will be made by its fire department to attend all fires within the Town area covered by this contract, whenever it is notified of such fire, subject to the following conditions:

- A. Two or more fire calls received from the Town officers or from property owners, within the area covered by fire protection contracts or mutual aid contracts, shall be answered in the order of their receipt unless the fire chief or other officer in charge of the fire department at the time otherwise directs.
- B. Road and weather conditions must be such that the fire run can be made with reasonable safety to the firefighters and equipment of the City. The decision of the fire chief or other officer in charge of the fire department at the time that the fire run cannot be made with reasonable safety to firefighters and equipment shall be final.
- C. The City shall not be liable to the Town or for loss or damage of any kind whatever resulting from any failure to furnish, or any delay to furnishing fire personnel or fire equipment, or from failure to prevent, control or extinguish any fire, unless such loss or damage is caused by the negligence of the officer, agents or other employees of the City or its fire department. The City agrees to defend and indemnify the Town against any claims brought or actions filed against the Town or any officer, employee, or volunteer of Town for injury to, death of, or damage to the property of any third person or persons, which are not excluded by the preceding sentence. Under no circumstances, however, shall City be required to pay on behalf of itself and Town, any amounts in excess of the limits on liability established in Minnesota Statutes Chapter 466 applicable to any one party. The limits of liability for Town and City may not be added together to determine the maximum amount of liability for City. The intent of this subdivision is to impose on City a limited duty to defend and indemnify Town for claims arising out of the performance of this contract subject to the limits of liability under Minnesota Statutes Chapter 466. The purpose of creating this duty to defend is to simplify the defense of claims by eliminating conflicts between the parties and to permit liability claims against both parties from a single occurrence to be defended by a single attorney. Nothing herein shall be construed to waive or limit any immunity from, or limitation on, liability available to either party, whether set forth in Minnesota Statutes Chapter 466 or otherwise.

In responding to fire calls within the Town area covered by this contract the fire chief or other officer in charge of the fire department at the time shall dispatch only such personnel and equipment as in their opinion can be safely spared from the City. In case an emergency arises within the City, while equipment and personnel of the fire department are engaged in fighting a fire within the Town area covered by this contract, the fire chief or other officer in charge of the fire department may, in their discretion, recall to the City such equipment and personnel as they may, in their opinion, consider necessary to meet the emergency.

Article III. The City Further agrees:

- A. To keep and maintain in good order the necessary apparatus and equipment for medical service, fire service, and fire protection within the Town area covered by this contract;
- B. To furnish not less than six (6) firefighters on each fire run;
- C. To furnish not less than three (3) firefighters on each medical/first response run;

If the charges are left unpaid for 60 days, the township will assume responsibility of the unpaid bill(s) and may seek reimbursement through property tax certification.
- E. Invoicing for fire calls will be sent directly to the Town for payment. Invoices for medical/first responder calls will be sent once to the homeowner/victim before being turned over to the Town for payment. All cancelled calls will be sent directly to the Town.
- F. The Town agrees to make a Town fire protection levy or otherwise to provide for funds each year in an amount sufficient to pay to the City the compensation above agreed upon.







Introduction

Minnesota law enforcement agencies submit data on criminal activity to meet state and federal reporting requirements. The data contained in this report are preliminary and based on data received from agencies to-date. As agencies continue to submit 2021 data these numbers will change. This report is being provided at the request of stakeholders, including the focus on the 7 metro counties, the formal 2021 crime report will still be forthcoming.

In addition, certain tables in this report contain only 2021 data (carjackings, victim, and offender data). Minnesota transitioned from summary crime reporting to a more detailed form of crime reporting, called National Incident-Based Reporting (NIBRS), in 2021. This new reporting method enables agencies to report on more kinds of incidents and in greater detail than ever before. Carjackings and most victim and offender data are available for the first time using the NIBRS reporting method. 2021 was the first full year of collecting this data. 2022 Legislative Preview by Tom Freeman/MCPA Lobbyist

The legislative session beings Monday and is expected to be one of the most unique in state history. The entire legislature, Governor, Attorney General, etc. are up for re-election in the fall and new legislative districts will be released from the Redistricting process in mid-February. This will make the session highly political. The state currently has an \$8 billion surplus and over \$1 billion if federal money at its disposal. This is historic on many levels and will cause significant problems for compromise. Minnesota is one of only two states that have a divided legislature in the country. The House Democrats and the Senate Republicans have very different priorities for the session and the surplus. The good news is that all legislative leaders and the Governor are prioritizing public safety in their budget proposals announced this week. While we do not have full legislative language for these proposals yet we wanted to highlight the three proposals below.

Governor Walz Budget Proposal

- •POST Board licensee database funding. This database would allow any member of the public to find public information on all licensed peace officers in Minnesota, including any final discipline in the form of licensing sanctions that have been taken against a peace officer.
- •Create a Violent Crime Reduction Support unit within the BCA to increase capacity to conduct forensic and investigatory work.
- •\$10 million for grants to support community policing initiatives. Grants would be awarded to prioritize violent crim and drug crime across the state.
- \bullet \$2 million for the creation of a First Responder Wellness Office to provide resources for improving the mental health of first responders statewide.
- •Body camera reimbursement program.

Additionally, the Governor's office will be rolling out their own legalization of cannabis bill this year. The details of the bill are not public yet and we will let you know when we have more details.

Senate Republican Proposal (The dollar amounts are yet to be released)

- •Funding for Pathways to Policing
- •Local agency grant program for recruitment and retention
- •Transparency in charging act
- •Making both the Sentencing Guideline Commission and POST Board appointees confirmed by the Senate
- •Mandatory minimum for violent crimes
- A new crime for carjacking where sentences would be served consecutively
- •Retention bonuses for agencies

House Democrat Proposal

- •\$40 Million for community safety grants. These grants would go to community nonprofits for violence interruption activities.
- •\$22 Million for local law enforcement to use for foot patrols in disproportionately elevated levels of crime. This funding sunsets in the language.
- •\$22 Million for crime investigations. The grants can be used for evidence processing technology and equipment or hiring investigatory personnel.
- •\$2.5 Million for body camera grants. This is a matching fund and also requires an agency to adopt several items into their local policy that our association has opposed for years.
- •\$450,000 for POST Board Investigators. It would fund 4 investigators through the POST Board to review and investigate code-of-conduct investigations among peace officers.
- •\$50,000 for a new POST Board Alternative Licensure task force focused on developing strategies to increase recruitment of officers.

As you can tell the three proposals are very different and include several things our association will support but also several things that we will oppose. We will continue to be your voice at the capitol and value your input. 





ARTICLE III

Unlawful Discharge

- Sec. 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to place, deposit, or permit to be deposited in any unsanitary manner on public or private property within the City, or in any area under jurisdiction, any human or animal excrement, garbage or objectionable waste.
- Sec. 2. It shall be unlawful to discharge to any natural outlet any wastewater or other polluted waters, except where suitable treatment has been provided in accordance with subsequent provisions of this ordinance and the City's NPDES/SDS Permit.
- Sec. 3. Except as provided hereinafter, it shall be unlawful to construct or maintain any privy, privy vault, septic tank, cesspool, or other facility intended or used for the disposal of wastewater.
- Sec. 4. The owner(s) of all houses, buildings, or properties used for human occupancy, employment, recreation or other purposes from which wastewater is discharged, and which is situated within the City and adjacent to any street, alley, or right-of-way in which there is now located, or may in the future be located, a public sanitary sewer of the City, shall be required at the owner(s) expense to install a suitable service connection to the public sewer in accordance with provisions of this Code, within ninety (90) days of the date said public sewer is operational, provided said public sewer is within 150 feet of the structure generating the wastewater. All future buildings constructed on property adjacent to the public sewer shall be required to immediately connect to the public sewer. If sewer connections are not made pursuant to this section, an official thirty (30) day notice shall be served instructing the affected property owner to make said connection.
- Sec. 5. In the event an owner shall fail to connect to a public sewer in compliance with a notice given under Article III, Section 4 of the Ordinance, the City must undertake to have said connection made and shall assess the cost thereof against the benefitted property. Such assessment, when levied, shall bear interest at the rate determined by the City Council and shall be certified to the Auditor of the County of Benton, Minnesota and shall be collected and remitted to the City in the same manner as assessments for local improvements. The rights of the City shall be in addition to any remedial or enforcement provisions of this ordinance.

Consent Agenda

The MnDOT Cooperative Construction Agreement is in your packet. This draft may have a few modifications to it related to storm sewer inspection, maintenance of the trail and some of the cost estimates which have slightly changed. Staff is waiting for the revisions from the state but they have asked us to authorize the agreement and resolution at the February meeting in order to keep the timeline for bidding which is anticipated in March. We expect a bill from the state to pay for our additional costs (mostly utility related) in May.

We have made a slight modification to the township fire contract for Gilmanton Township as requested by their attorney at the fire meeting. Since some other townships had already signed their contracts without the change, we opted to only modify contracts which request the change. You have 2 different versions of the fire contracts in your consent agenda, all townships will be covered by these versions and our attorney has reviewed them. Moving forward to the next contract we will make sure they are consistent across all townships.

The personnel committee is recommending moving forward with the hire of an additional part-time police officer from the eligibility list.

The fire relief association has presented a letter which shifts \$1,000 from one line item in the city fire fund to the relief association payment (also in the city fire fund). The relief would also assume all financial responsibility for the fire relief audit. This would be effective immediately. I have spoken to the relief and appreciate them working with city staff to address this item. This does satisfy the concerns I have with the city's involvement with fire relief administrative costs.

In your packet is a map that show a recommendation to place a yield sign in the industrial park. With the additional traffic in this area staff is supportive of this installation to improve safety. Any questions on this placement can be directed to public works.

Staff has worked on formatting and a few small changes in the police department policies/procedures. The policies are extremely long (about 300 pages) so an entire electronic copy (either file or dropbox) will be provided to you and just the summary sheet will be in the packet. I will also have a hard copy printed for the meeting.

Wastewater Project

We are finally through the permit renewal process and ready to move ahead with bidding. Jared Voge will be at the meeting to provide an update on the final plans an specs and request authorization to move ahead with the bidding process. Summary information is in your packet which includes the major components of the project. Mr. Voge can answer any questions you have at the meeting.

Industrial Park Wetlands

Jarod Griffith will provide an update on the wetland delineation process and also review some concepts we have put together for the park. Staff will need council direction on how to proceed with the wetland application process.

Vac Truck Purchase

The vac truck is ready so the updated quote (just new date – price is the same) is in your packet. We'll ask council to approve again since it's been quite the long time since we initially addressed it. Council will also be asked to authorize staff to auction off the old vac on February 23, 2022.

Sewer Ordinance

Staff needs to update the code on water/sewer required connections. Since this language was developed the city has entered into a wellhead protection program and expensed significant resources on expanding water/sewer services with the assistance of state funding. We need to make sure our code complies with obligations we have with other state programs. Staff would like to have a discussion with the council on a number of considerations prior to updating the code.
